

Dam Worker Killed When Board Falls

Struck in the head by a 2x4 which fell some 60 feet, George Faulkner, grout machine mixer-man, was killed at 3:15 a. m. today on the dam workings.

Faulkner was not wearing a hard hat at the time; the force of the blow fractured his skull, according to physicians.

Faulkner was working below the railroad trestle, and a concrete bucket scraped the section of two-by-four off the trestle. It fell 60 feet, striking him squarely on the head.

Faulkner's wife is away, visiting in Minnesota. The body of deceased is at the Parks mortuary in Boulder City, awaiting word from Mrs. Faulkner. The family home is at 513 New Mexico, Boulder City.

Faulkner had been working for Six Companies Inc., since January 26, 1932.
