

BUCKS BOULDER LIQUOR RULES AND IS NABBED BY OFFICERS

BOULDER CITY, Jan. 9.—C. C. Cornell, a Six Companies employe, was found in possession of a quantity of bottle liquor in his dormitory room late Sunday night, and was taken into custody by reservation police.

Early Monday he was brought before City Manager Sims' Ely, who expelled him from the reservation in accordance with the well defined rule which has received such widespread publicity that all may be fairly warned of the penalty of drunkenness or possession of liquor by any person upon the reservation.

Boulder City authorities turned Cornell over to U. S. Commissioner Flowers late Monday afternoon.

When Cornell was asked if he had not seen the warnings posted all over the reservation concerning liquor offenses, he said he had read the warning "but thought he would get by."
