

HOOVER DAM NAME CHANGE IS DEFEATED

Cahlan Measure Meets With Defeat; Wage Scale Is Raised

CARSON CITY, Feb. 3. (U.P.)—The assembly late today defeated, by a vote of 20 to 19, one member being absent, the resolution proposing to change the name of Hoover dam to Boulder dam, Speaker Alward casting the deciding vote, in the interest of harmony.

Assemblyman Cahlan brought in a majority report of the committee, asking that congress officially designate the dam as Boulder dam.

Assemblyman Ernest S. Brown, youthful Reno attorney, opposed the move, claiming that such an act would be disrespectful to the office of President of the United States, and convincingly presented his point.

The bill by Assemblyman Johnson of Washoe county, proposing to reduce the salary of the president of the University of Nevada to \$6,000 per year was defeated.

The bill proposing a minimum wage of five dollars per day on all public works was brought up for reconsideration on motion of Assemblyman Hamlin of Mineral county, and later passed by the assembly. It is now going to the senate.

Both houses adjourned over the week-end until Monday at 11 a. m., to permit committees to prepare legislation for action.
