

# MAN SAID HURT AND KIDNAPED BY PAIR NOW BEING SOUGHT BY COPS

R. V. Turner Wounded In  
Shoulder, Carted Over  
Desert, Finally Freed

## HUNT NOT A SUCCESS

Wanted Pair Believed To  
Have Tried To Attack  
Two Women

Sheriff's deputies, city police and Boulder City rangers had spread a dragnet today for two men, known only as "Red" and "Parker Hill," believed to be Boulder dam workers, who last night are alleged to have tried to attack two girls, engaged in a fight in which a Las Vegas man was badly stabbed and then kidnaped and a second man run into the desert following a fight on the Boulder dam highway just east of Midway about 2:30 this morning.

According to an investigation made by Deputy Sheriff Wm. E. Mott, B. V. Turner and Roy Landrum were coming in from the dance at Railroad Pass this morning when they were flagged down by a woman, standing in the middle of the highway, who said that "they're killing a woman in that car", indicating a machine parked on the south side of the highway.

**LANDRUM STEPPED** out of the car in which he was riding and as soon as he stepped on the running board of the parked car, "Red" came at him and the fight was on.

Turner, who was driving his car, leaped out and came to the aid of his companion, Landrum, and as he did so, Hill jumped from the back seat of the other machine and the battle raged for more than five minutes.

**IN THE FIGHT**, Turner received an ugly flesh wound in his left shoulder while Landrum, according to Mott, fled out into the desert.

While the fight was going on, the two girls, according to the report made by Mott, jumped from "Red's" car into Turners and drove it down the road to escape. They made several trips back to the scene of the fight in an effort to allow Turner and Landrum to jump on and escape, but they had no luck, so they turned around and

drove the car to Sorrell's service station.

When the fight ended, the report said, "Red" and "Hill" kidnaped Turner and drove him around the country for more than an hour and a half and then finally dumped him out at Sorrell's with the warning "don't tell the law or we'll kill you" and fled into the darkness.

**TURNER, WHO** was fearful lest the two desperadoes find Landrum, who was missing at that time, drove to the reservation gate and informed the officers there, who immediately got in touch with the sheriff's office in Las Vegas.

All this time Landrum was still missing and when Mott arrived at the scene of the fight, he and Turner made a survey of all the nearby country but could not locate him. So they returned to Las Vegas.

**THIS MORNING**, about eight o'clock, Landrum made his appearance and reported himself all right.

This morning a determined search for "Red" and "Hill" was being made, but up until press time no trace had been found.
