

Fire Results In Eviction From B. C.

When Robert Miller, Six Companies employe, set fire to paper in a corner of his dormitory room this morning, he attracted not only the fire department of the company, but officers as well.

This afternoon he's out of a job—and out of Boulder City. For he had been drinking, and a pint whiskey bottle one-fourth full, besides three empties, were found in his room, according to police.

He had not been creating any disturbance—until the fire had to be put out by the firemen.

Altus Munley, employed by the Bureau of Reclamation since October 1931 on the dam project, was ordered to leave the reservation this morning and his Ford roadster, in which he assertedly attempted to enter the reservation while under influence of liquor, is in the stockade at the gate.

Munley, who was a survey gang member, had a half gallon of liquor under the seat of the car. W. H. Price, a "passenger," apparently had not been drinking, it is said.
