

Pair Nabbed For Indian Rum Sale

Forrest K. Shaw, alleged Texas Acres bootlegger, was being held for trial by the federal court following the sale of two pints of whiskey to Indians yesterday, according to information given by W. J. Flowers, U. S. commissioner in Las Vegas.

According to testimony given before Flowers, Shaw had sold some whiskey to the Apache Indians, who are working on the dam project, prior to the time they were caught and Chief of Police Bodell arrested the Indians while they were under the influence of the liquor.

He got the ~~Indians~~ to return to the place and, with marked money, purchase more liquor and when they came out of the place, Bodell arrested Shaw.

Simultaneously to the time Bodell was arresting Shaw in the front of the building, Sheriff Joe Keate, of Las Vegas, entered the establishment by the rear door and arrested J. H. Marquette, as a party to the crime.

Shaw's bond was placed at \$2,500, which he did not make, when he pleaded guilty to the charge of selling liquor to Indians.

Shaw and Marquette are both being held to appear in the federal court and were placed in the Boulder City jail.
