STATEMENTS ISSUED

Sims Ely, City Manager,
Tells All Details Of Ne-
gotiations So Far

With 700 Boulder City gram-
mar school students without
school facilities, and little or no
immediate prospect of obtaining
any relief, public sentiment in
the dam site community was
reaching the boiling point today,
with principal resentment being
directed toward state superin-
tendent of public instruction W.
W. Anderson, who has refused
to sanction the establishment of
the school district there until
Six Companies actually pays
over the tax money it has agreed
to pay under the terms of the
recent compromise with the
county and state.

Developments in the situation
included:

1.—Holding of an indignation
meeting by the Boulder City Le-
gion Post at which resolutions
were passed condemning the situ-
ation and wired immediately to
Governor Balzar and attorney-
general Gray Mashburn.

2.—Dspatch of a wire from
District attorney Harley A. Har-
mon to attorney-general Gray
Mashburn urging action and in-
sisting that Anderson appoint
school board so the district can
start to function.

3.—Issuance of a lengthy state-
ment by Sims Ely, city manager
of Boulder City, explaining the
situation in detail, revealing all
correspondence with the state
superintendent, and declaring his
(Ely's) inability to understand
the attitude of Anderson.

4.—Plans for holding a mass
meeting of Boulder City parents
and others interested, to protest
against the stand of the state
superintendent.
