Details Are Being Settled This Afternoon; Registration Next Week

Boulder City schools, storm-center of a controversy during the past two weeks which embroiled several state officials, will open on Monday, September 25, it was tentatively announced today by reclamation bureau and Six Companies officials after a lengthy conference with W. W. Anderson, state superintendent of public instruction who finally appointed the school board to handle the affairs of the district, and complete the organization started by the board of county commissioners last month.

In conferences yesterday and this morning, Anderson found the various agencies at Boulder City ready and willing to cooperate to whatever extent was necessary, and as a result the opening of the schools was materially expedited.

MEMBERS OF THE first school board for the dam site city were: J. R. Alexander, A. H. Ayers, and Earl Brothers, and their credentials were issued this afternoon by the state superintendent.

Six Companies agreed to advance whatever money is necessary in the shape of an emergency loan to the district to operate until state and county apportionments are available, and it is expected the board will be able to start immediately on plans for opening the schools and enrolling the 700 pupils who have been without school facilities for the past two weeks.

MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 25 was set as the earliest possible date that regular classes can be gotten under way, but it is expected that registration will be undertaken next week in order that everything may be in readiness by that time.
