

Anderson Approval Of
District Is Awaited By
Entire City

ACTION IS DELAYED

Loan Would Be Made In
Any Form Necessary,
According to Officials

Six Companies Incorporated, Boulder dam builders, and Babcock-Wilcox company, pipe manufacturers on the job, have agreed to supply the necessary funds for an emergency loan to the new Boulder City school district, if and when Superintendent of Public Instruction Walter Anderson gives his necessary approval to its establishment. It was revealed yesterday by Sims Ely, city manager of Boulder City, and W. F. Alexander, attorney for the reclamation bureau.

The loan would be made in whatever form necessary to allow the school board of the proposed district to finance the operation of the elementary schools for the first semester under state control, or until state and county apportionments are available.

FINANCING the district until the Six Companies paid their taxes under the terms of the agreement recently entered into by the county commissioners, district attorney and the dam contractors, has been the stumbling block in the school situation to date, because of the slight chance that something might happen to block the tax settlement agreed upon.

School authorities familiar with the situation state that the offer of the contractors as explained by Ely and Alexander, should clear away all the obstacles to early establishment of the school district but latest word from Carson City is to the effect that Superintendent Anderson is still "sitting tight" as he advised Ruth Olmstead, his deputy in Clark county, to do by wire recently.

THE BOARD of county commissioners recently voted to create the school district but Anderson has declared he will not move until the taxes are actually paid in by the contracting company sometime in November or December.

Just what will happen to the Boulder City elementary schools and the 700 prospective pupils was still a mystery, as a result of Superintendent Anderson's stand, and little information was forthcoming from Carson City where the superintendent holds forth.
