

Torch Needed To Save Hurt Worker

It required an electric torch to extricate "Curley" Adams, Boulder Dam worker, when he was caught between the agitator and frame of one of the big concrete barrels at the high mixing plant down in the canyon last night, and while Adams had a narrow escape from serious injury, he is expected to be out of the hospital within the next few days none the worse for wear.

Adams was standing on the loaded concrete barrel when the mechanic attempting to close the rear door, turned it over, pinning the unfortunate workman between the agitator and the frame.

It was necessary to have a "burner" cut the bolts and remove an entire section of the frame before Adams could be released.

It was first feared his right leg had been broken, but examination revealed it was only badly bruised.
