

Kingman Road

Being Pushed Now

With the appropriation of \$200,000 to construct the first three miles of the Arizona highway from Boulder dam to Kingman, the drive to complete this important route under the public works program now getting under way, was given further impetus by the receipt of word that Hal Mitchell, member of the Arizona highway commission; E. D. Newcomer, of the Phoenix Republic, leading Arizona daily, and Norman G. Wallace of the highway department were spending the day today going over the proposed highway.

They came here as a result of instructions from the chairman of the Arizona highway commission, according to word received by President A. C. Grant of the chamber of commerce, and are planning in addition to getting funds for construction of the route, to inaugurate a publicity campaign throughout southern California to acquaint them with the new highway as a route into Arizona by the way of Boulder dam.

Word was received last week that construction of the first three miles leading from the dam site over the particularly rugged country on the Arizona side would be undertaken at once thru the allocation of a \$200,000 fund by the highway commission.

It is hoped that sufficient funds to complete the highway into Kingman can be secured from Arizona's share of the highway funds included in the public works program.
