

FINAL APPROVAL TO COMPROMISE

Way Now Cleared For
Payment of Levies By
Dam Contractors

FEW MINOR CHANGES

Adds Two Million And
Half To Valuation Of
Clark Co. This Year

CARSON CITY, Sept. 12. (U.P.)
—Attorney-general Gray Mashburn last night formally approved the Boulder dam tax compromise whereby Six Companies Incorporated agreed to pay 1931, 1932 and 1933 taxes, and all future assessments, and following the recommendation of the attorney-general, the state tax commission took similar action, ordering County Assessor F. C. Devinney to place the assessments on the rolls of Clark county.

A few minor changes were made in the original compromise as agreed upon by assistant district attorney Roger Foley and the Clark county board of commissioners, and the total to be paid by the dam contractors was set at approximately \$18,000, including poll taxes.

Of this amount the state of Nevada will receive \$22,000 the remainder going to the various departments of Clark county government.

BY VIRTUE OF this compromise a total of \$2,556,482 is added to the tax rolls of Clark county, including Six Companies Incorporated, Boulder City Company, and Anderson Bros. Supply Company.

This will bring Clark county's assessed valuation to a total of \$15,833,818.

THE APPROVAL of this settlement by the tax commission definitely clears the way for payment of the back taxes by the contractors, and is expected to clear up the school situation which has been assuming serious proportions during the past several days.
