

Eleven Miles of Highway To Be Under Construc- tion Soon

Two projects on the Boulder Dam highway leading into Kingman, Arizona will be under way within the next few weeks, according to Thomas H. MacDonald, chief of the bureau of public roads in Washington, D. C.

In a letter to United States Senator Henry F. Ashurst, MacDonald states that on August 10, a national recovery secondary project, involving eight miles, estimated to cost \$100,000 was approved. This project joins the present gravel highway 10 miles northeast of Chloride and covers the eight mile flat this side.

The second project calls for construction of three miles in the vicinity of the Boulder Dam, estimated to cost \$217,570, and will take care of the extremely heavy work on the Arizona approach to the dam.

Both have been approved and will be started in the near future.

The distance from Chloride to the dam site is 66 miles. A good gravel highway now connects Kingman with Chloride. Construction of the 11 miles contemplated in the two projects outlined above leaves 55 miles yet to be built.
