

Travel Shows Thirty Per  
Cent Increase Here In  
August, Pointed Out

## WILL KEEP LEAD

---

119,000 Visitors Recorded  
Here For Year So Far;  
10 Per Cent Jump

---

The Arrowhead Trail, leading thru Las Vegas and Boulder City, jumped to first place among all tourist routes to the coast during the months of July and August, it as revealed today by Secretary Nye Wilson of the Las Vegas chamber of commerce upon completion of a tabulation of figures on all gateways into California.

The Yuma, Arizona route, for years in first place, dropped into second position, with Hornbrook Oregon occupying third place.

Comparative figures showing the number of tourists for the two months showed:

This data, according to Wilson, was secured from the quarantine stations at the two portals into California.

A YEAR AGO, Las Vegas advanced from third place to second, displacing the Oregon gateway as a favorite route for tourist travel. Wilson predicts that with the Boulder Dam continuing to attract large numbers of visitors to this area, Las Vegas will give Yuma a close run for first place in the year's totals compiled in December.

August showed a thirty one per cent increase in tourist travel thru Las Vegas over the same month a year ago, Wilson pointed out, while the gain into California as a whole was but five per cent.

**THE OVER ALL** gain to date is slightly less than 10 per cent, Wilson states, with 119,640 tourists checked in over the Arrowhead Trail for the first eight months of the year as against 197,000 for all of 1932.

The totals of the two Arizona routes thru Kingman and Yuma is only slightly in excess of the total number thru Las Vegas alone. Wilsons' figures show.
