

# TO FIX RIGHT IN DAM SECTOR

## Jurisdiction In One-Time Reserve To Be Thresh- ed Out In Carson

Jurisdictional matters, concerning the Boulder dam area are to be settled by agreement this week in a conference between United States Attorney Harry Atkinson and Harley A. Harmon, district attorney for Clark county.

Harmon left this morning for the north and expects to spend several days going over the situation with Atkinson in detail, following through on the actual settlement of the reservation question by Judge Frank H. Norcross and final acceptance of the decree without contest, both by the federal government through Secretary Ickes and Six Companies incorporated through the compromise of the tax suits.

**THERE ARE** many matters remaining to be ironed out, including those of licenses and policing the reservation. Harmon stated before departing there is no radical change contemplated in the matter of police protection but that

he desires to get the legal status of the officers straightened out.

While in Carson City, Harmon will discuss with the state board of finance the proposal to transfer to the general fund some of the money from the various funds into which the recently paid tax money



is allocated, in order that outstanding bond issues may be retired. The largest single fund in which this is contemplated, is the county highway fund to which all poll tax moneys are allocated by law, and which would be built up to over \$50,000 by the lump payment of taxes from the dam contractors and affiliates for the three years just past.

**THE STATE** board of finance has the power to authorize this transfer, Harmon points out, and he is seeking permission on behalf of the county.
