Subject: Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) for Native Fish Restoration in Redrock Canyon
(Action by October 15, 2007)

The Bureau of Reclamation has issued the attached draft EA to solicit public comments on the potential environmental effects of a proposed aquatic ecosystem restoration project in the Redrock Canyon watershed, Sierra Vista Ranger District, Coronado National Forest, Santa Cruz County, Arizona. The proposed project would include construction of a fish barrier, removal of nonnative fish and frogs, and restoration of the native fish and amphibian fauna. The EA was prepared in cooperation with the U.S. Forest Service, Arizona Game and Fish Department, and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.
