Dear Mr. Cassens:

In accordance with Title 43, Code of Federal Regulations Part 417, this letter provides the City with the Bureau of Reclamation's determination regarding the City's proposed diversion and beneficial use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2011.

Under its Colorado River water delivery contract with the United States (Contract No. 3-07-30-W0039), the City is entitled to divert up to 19,180 acre-feet of Arizona fourth-priority Colorado River water per year for use within the City's contract service area. The City also holds a fifth and sixth priority right for an unspecified amount of water, and entitlements to 7,000 acre-feet and 2,139 acre-feet of Arizona fourth-priority Colorado River water under subcontracts with the Mohave County Water Authority.

Based upon the review of factors related to the diversion estimate provided by the City, Reclamation approves the diversion of up to 17,697 acre-feet of Colorado River water for use in the City's service area for 2011.

Reclamation will monitor and project diversions and consumptive use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2011 in an effort to ensure that the entitlement of each authorized user is not exceeded. Beginning in February 2011, these projections will be available to water users on a daily basis on Reclamation's web site: www.usbr.gov/lc/region/g4000/hourly/forecast11.pdf. It is expected that Arizona entitlement holders will use this information to adjust diversions to remain within approved annual quantities.

Dear Mr. Cotter:

In accordance with Title 43, Code of Federal Regulations Part 417, this letter provides the City with the Bureau of Reclamation's determination regarding the City's proposed diversion and beneficial use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2011.

Under its Colorado River water delivery contract with the United States (Contract No. 2-07-30-W0273), the City is entitled to divert up to 15,210 acre-feet of fourth priority Colorado River water per year for use within the City's contract service area. The City also has entitlements to 7,000 acre-feet and 2,139 acre-feet of Arizona fourth-priority Colorado River water under subcontracts with the Mohave County Water Authority.

Based upon the review of factors related to the diversion estimate provided by the City, Reclamation approves the diversion of up to 12,720 acre-feet of Colorado River water for use in the City's service area for 2011.

Reclamation will monitor and project diversions and consumptive use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2011 in an effort to ensure the entitlement of each authorized user is not exceeded. In accordance with Title 43, Code of Federal Regulations Part 417, this letter provides the Town with the Bureau of Reclamation's determination regarding the Town's proposed diversion and beneficial use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2011.


Under its Colorado River water delivery contract with the United States (Contract No. 2-07-30-W0025), the Town is entitled to divert up to 630 acre-feet of Arizona first priority Colorado River water per year for use within the Town's contract service area. The Town also holds an Arizona fourth priority right to divert up to 1,030 acre-feet and a fifth or sixth priority right for 2,000 acre-feet.

Based upon review of factors related to the estimate of diversion provided by the Town, Reclamation approves the diversion of up to 981 acre-feet of Colorado River water for use in the Town's service area (including present perfected right lands) for 2011.

Reclamation will monitor and project diversions and consumptive use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2011 in an effort to ensure the entitlement of each authorized user is not exceeded. Beginning in February 2011, these projections will be available to water users on a daily basis on Reclamation's web site: www.usbr.gov/lc/region/g4000/hourly/forecast11.pdf. It is expected that Arizona entitlement holders will use this information to adjust diversions to remain within approved annual quantities.

In accordance with Title 43, Code of Federal Regulations Part 417, this letter provides ASLD with the Bureau of Reclamation's determination regarding ASLD's proposed diversion and beneficial use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2011.

Under its Colorado River water delivery contract with the United States (Contract No. 4-07-30-W0317), ASLD is entitled to annually divert up to 6,607 acre-feet of fourth priority Colorado River water for use within ASLD's contract service area as well as a fifth or sixth priority right for 9,067 acre-feet of water for irrigation use. Furthermore, ASLD has a separate Colorado River water delivery contract (Contract No. 7-07-30-W0358) for 1,534 acre-feet of fourth priority water for domestic purposes.



Subject: Approval of Calendar Year 2011 Diversion for the Central Arizona Water Conservation District (District)

Dear Mr. Modeer:

In accordance with Title 43, Code of Federal Regulations Part 417, this letter provides the District with the Bureau of Reclamation's determination regarding the District's proposed diversion and beneficial use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2011.

The District is entitled to divert the balance of Arizona's 2,800,000 acre-foot apportionment not consumed by higher priority Arizona entitlement holders. However in 2011, the Arizona apportionment has been adjusted downward by 11,659 acre-feet, reflecting the 2011 payback obligation incurred by the District in 2009, to 2,788,341 acre-feet.

Based upon the approved water orders of higher priority Arizona entitlement holders and the above mentioned payback obligation of the District, Reclamation approves the diversion of 1,533,958 acre-feet of Colorado River water for use in the District's contract service area for calendar year 2011.

In addition, Reclamation approves the diversion, by the District, of any Arizona apportionment unused by higher priority Arizona entitlement holders as projected on Reclamation's 2011 Forecasted Water Use website. Diversion of this water is subject to the following conditions:

- (1) The data on the website are provisional until final records are issued. Any diversions made as a result of the values on the website are at the District's own risk.
- (2) All available Colorado River water within Arizona has been approved for beneficial use within the state. The approved amounts remain available to the senior priority entitlement holders. In cases where approvals to senior entitlement holders are less than their diversion


entitlement, the approvals may be increased to their full entitlement as defined in their contract.

- (3) Final accounting records published by Reclamation may differ from the provisional data on the website. Adjustments to the final records may result in an inadvertent overrun by the District.
- (4) The District will be required to pay back any overrun according to the IOPP.
- (5) Reclamation may, at any time, rescind this approval to divert unused Arizona apportionment of Colorado River water.

Reclamation will monitor and project diversions and consumptive use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2011 in an effort to ensure the entitlement of each authorized user is not exceeded. 





Water rights for lands within the District are based on water right certificates which provide for delivery of the quantity of water which can be beneficially used for irrigation of individual lands covered by the water right certificate.

Based upon review of factors related to the diversion estimate provided by the District, Reclamation approves the diversion of up to 32,150 acre-feet of Colorado River water for use in the District's service area for calendar year 2011.

Reclamation will monitor and project diversions and consumptive use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2011 in an effort to ensure the entitlement of each authorized user is not exceeded. Beginning in February 2011, these projections will be available to water users on a daily basis on Reclamation's web site: www.usbr.gov/lc/region/g4000/hourly/forecast11.pdf. It is expected that Arizona entitlement holders will use this information to adjust diversions to remain within approved annual quantities.



In accordance with Title 43, Code of Federal Regulations Part 417, this letter provides the District with the Bureau of Reclamation's determination regarding the District's proposed diversion and beneficial use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2011.

In accordance with the District's amended contract it has a fourth priority entitlement for 9,366 acre-feet, which includes 300 acre-feet for domestic use. The District also has a fifth priority entitlement for 1,500 acre-feet and a sixth priority surplus entitlement for 2,000 acre-feet.

Within the District boundaries, other entities have entitlements to Colorado River water and the District orders water on behalf of these entities. The Mohave County Water Authority has a fourth priority entitlement for 4,278 acre-feet. The Hopi Tribe has a fourth priority entitlement for 4,278 acre-feet, a fifth priority entitlement for 750 acre-feet, and a sixth priority entitlement for 1,000 acre-feet. The Arizona Game and Fish Department has a fourth priority entitlement for 2,838 acre-feet, a fifth priority entitlement for 750 acre-feet, and a sixth priority entitlement for 1,000 acre-feet. Arizona Recreational Facilities LLC has a fourth priority entitlement for 2,700 acre-feet.

The District's request results in the delivery of all fourth priority, a portion of all fifth priority, and none of the sixth priority water entitlements that are within its boundaries as indicated in the table below.

- (4) 656 acre-feet of fifth priority unused Arizona entitlement.



Based on the elevation of Lake Mead on January 1, 2007, the Farm's inadvertent overrun was subject to a 3-year payback term beginning in calendar year 2009. The Farm is on track to successfully repay its inadvertent overrun obligation in full in 2010. Subsequently, the Farm's 2011 diversion approval is based upon its full entitlement of 9,156 acre-feet.
