Subject: Approval of Calendar Year 2014 Colorado River Diversion for the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (Service)

Dear Dr. Tuggle:

In accordance with Title 43, Code of Federal Regulations Part 417 (Part 417), this letter provides the Service with notice of my determination regarding the Service's proposed diversion and beneficial use of Colorado River water for calendar year 2014.

As provided in Article II(D)(7) of the Consolidated Decree of the Supreme Court of the United States in *Arizona v. California* (547 U.S.150 (2006)) (Consolidated Decree), the Havasu Lake National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) is entitled to divert up to 41,839 acre-feet per year, or consumptively use up to 37,399 acre-feet per year, whichever is less, of Arizona second priority Colorado River water to fulfill the purposes of the refuge.

As provided in Article II(D)(8) of the Consolidated Decree, the Imperial NWR is entitled to divert up to 28,000 acre-feet per year, or consumptively use up to 23,000 acre-feet per year, whichever is less, of Arizona second priority Colorado River water to fulfill the purposes of the refuge.

Under Secretarial Reservation, published in the *Federal Register* at 47 Fed. Reg. 55430 (December 9, 1982), the Cibola NWR is entitled to divert up to 34,500 acre-feet per year, or consumptively use up to 16,793 acre-feet per year, whichever is less, of Arizona second priority Colorado River water with a priority date of August 21, 1964 to fulfill the purposes of the refuge.

Based upon a review of the calendar year 2014 diversion estimate provided by the Service, and the information gathered during the Bureau of Reclamation's annual Part 417 consultation process, I approve a total diversion of up to 66,594 acre-feet of Colorado River water during

calendar year 2014 for use on the Service's refuges within the state of Arizona. Diversions to each refuge are limited to the amounts indicated in the table below.

Reclamation will monitor and project diversions and consumptive use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2014 in an effort to ensure each entitlement holder's annual approval is not exceeded. Beginning in February 2014, these projections will be available to water users on a daily basis on Reclamation's website: www.usbr.gov/lc/region/g4000/hourly/forecast14.pdf. It is expected that entitlement holders within the state of Arizona will use this information to adjust diversions to remain within approved annual quantities or, as appropriate, seek modification of the approval.
