Subject: Receipt of Calendar Year 2015 Tribal Diversion Approval from the Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA)

Dear Mr. Bowker:

The Bureau of Reclamation has received BIA's memorandum dated November 6, 2014, through which BIA provided its formal determination of calendar year 2015 Colorado River diversions for the Fort Mojave, Colorado River, Cocopah, Chemehuevi, and Fort Yuma (Quechan) Indian Tribes (Tribes). In accordance with Title 43, Code of Federal Regulations Part 417, this letter provides BIA with notice that Reclamation has no comments or objections to BIA's determination. The determination made by BIA is reflected in the table below.

¹As shown here, the Cocopah Indian Tribe's diversion entitlement includes an estimated entitlement for use on the Cocopah Indian Tribe's Fee land parcel located within a portion of the area described in Present Perfected Right No. 7. The amount of this entitlement is currently under review.

Reclamation notes that, in accordance with the Inadvertent Overrun and Payback Policy, the Cocopah Indian Tribe has a payback obligation in 2015 of 149 acre-feet. Reclamation appreciates BIA's efforts to help ensure the Cocopah Indian Tribe's conservation of water to meet its payback obligation.

Reclamation will monitor and project diversions and consumptive use of Colorado River water during calendar year 2015 in an effort to ensure each entitlement holder's annual approval is not exceeded.

Beginning in January 2015, these projections will be available to water users on a daily basis on Reclamation's website: www.usbr.gov/lc/region/g4000/hourly/forecast15.pdf. It is expected that the Tribes will use this information to adjust diversions to remain within approved annual quantities or, as appropriate, seek modification of the approval.
