Subject: Bureau of Indian Affairs' (BIA) Approval of Calendar Year (CY) 2024 Tribal Colorado

River Water Diversions

Dear Ms. Durham:

The Bureau of Reclamation received BIA's memorandum dated November 22, 2023, through which BIA provided its formal determination of CY 2024 Colorado River water diversions for the Fort Mojave, Colorado River, Cocopah, Chemehuevi, and Fort Yuma (Quechan) Indian Tribes (Tribes). In accordance with Title 43, Code of Federal Regulations Part 417, this letter provides BIA with notice that Reclamation has no comments or objections to BIA's determination. The diversion amounts for each tribe as approved per the determination made by BIA are reflected in the enclosed Table 1.

On August 15, 2023, Reclamation released its Colorado River Basin August 2024 24-Month Study, which projects Lake Mead's most probable elevation on January 1, 2024 to be 1,065.27 feet. In its letter dated August 24, 2023, Reclamation announced that, in accordance with the 2007 Interim Guidelines, Lake Mead and the lower Colorado River will operate in a Tier 1 Shortage Condition in CY 2024. In addition, the 2019 *Lower Basin Drought Contingency Plan Agreement* (LB DCP Agreement) will also govern the operation of Lake Mead for CY 2024. The CY 2024 Shortage Condition and DCP Contributions required by the LB DCP Agreement do not impact the available Colorado River water supply for the Tribes.

Reclamation would like to highlight that, in accordance with the *Inadvertent Overrun and Payback Policy*,³ accumulations of inadvertent overruns are not permitted in CY 2024 and are suspended as long as a Shortage Condition is in effect. To assist entitlement holders in monitoring their Colorado River water use to ensure they remain within available quantities,

Reclamation will project CY 2024 diversions and consumptive use of Colorado River water during CY 2024 and will make these projections available daily on Reclamation's website⁴ beginning in January 2024. Reclamation encourages Colorado River water entitlement holders to use the projections to adjust diversions to remain within their Reclamation-approved annual Colorado River water order.

Dear Chairman Williams:

On November 7, 2023, a meeting attended by Wes Davis, Jon DeOcampo, and Cecil Collier of the Fort Mojave Tribal Utilities Authority; Andrew Harter (General Manger, Avi Kwa Ame Farms); Jonathan Cody (Irrigation Engineer, Bureau of Indian Affairs [BIA]); and representatives of the Bureau of Reclamation was held. The purpose of the meeting was to engage in a 43 CFR, Part 417 (Part 417) consultation with the Ft. Mojave Indian Tribe (Tribe). During this consultation meeting the Tribe's 2024 Colorado River water usage requirements and plans were discussed.

With consideration given to discussion held during the aforementioned consultation meeting and in fulfillment of responsibilities described in Part 417, the Regional Director, Western Regional Office, BIA has formally determined the Tribe's 2024 Colorado River water order. This water order is provided in the table below. The water order figures are equivalent to the estimated diversions for agriculture previously provided by Mr. Harter, with municipal diversion estimates for Arizona and Nevada added in. Municipal diversion estimates for Arizona and Nevada (3,500 acre-feet and 1,600 acre-feet respectively) were provided by Jon DeOcampo (Operations Manager, For Mojave Tribal Utilities Authority). A copy of the Tribe's completed consultation questionnaire is enclosed.
