Subject: Approval of Revised Calendar Year (CY) 2025 Colorado River Water Order –

Bard Water District (BWD)

Dear Mr. Bahr:

The Bureau of Reclamation received BWD's letter dated May 2, 2025, revising BWD's Colorado River water diversion estimate for CY 2025. In accordance with Title 43, Code of Federal Regulations Part 417, this letter provides BWD with notice of my determination regarding BWD's revised diversion and beneficial use of Colorado River water for CY 2025.

BWD's revised diversion request incorporates a reduction of 9,286 acre-feet (AF) for purposes of implementing a Seasonal Land Fallowing Program (Fallowing Program), in which BWD has enrolled a total of 4,887.60 acres for the period April 1, 2025, through July 31, 2025. Pursuant to System Conservation Implementation Agreement No. 23-XX-30-W0773 dated September 23, 2024, as amended, water conserved by the Fallowing Program will remain in Lake Mead as System Conservation Water to benefit system storage.

Water rights for lands within BWD are based on water right certificates that provide for delivery of the quantity of water which can be beneficially used for irrigation of individual lands covered by the separate water right certificates.

Based upon a review of the revised CY 2025 diversion estimate provided by BWD, I approve the diversion of up to 37,514 AF of Colorado River water during CY 2025 for use in BWD's service area. This approved diversion results in an estimated consumptive use of 17,654 AF.

Reclamation would like to highlight that, in accordance with the *Inadvertent Overrun and Payback Policy*, ¹ accumulations of inadvertent overruns are not permitted in CY 2025 and are suspended as long as a Shortage Condition is in effect. To assist entitlement holders in monitoring their Colorado River water use to ensure they remain within available quantities,

Reclamation will continue to project CY 2025 diversions and consumptive use of Colorado River water during CY 2025 and will make these projections available daily on Reclamation's website.² Reclamation encourages Colorado River water entitlement holders to use the projections to adjust diversions to remain within their Reclamation-approved annual Colorado River water order.
