## **Reclamation to repeat public meeting on plans for properties within or near Boulder City Historic District; Seeks to identify concerns, get comments**

The Bureau of Reclamation will repeat the meeting it held January 27 regarding its plans for historic preservation of its properties within and near the Boulder City Historic District. At this meeting, Reclamation also will share its plans, seek to identify community and citizen concerns, and seek comments on its plans.

The repeat meeting will be on Thursday, February 5. It will be in Building 1300 at Reclamation's Date Street Complex in Boulder City. The complex is bordered by Fir, Date and Colorado Streets.

The meeting will be from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

"We recognize the historic values of the Boulder City Historic District and the importance of working with the local community to maintain the integrity of the District as much as possible," said Lower Colorado Deputy Regional Director Terry Fulp.

"We have been working closely with the Nevada State Historic Preservation Office and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation regarding our properties in Boulder City," he added. "We would like to share our ongoing and future plans with members of the community."

Building 1300 can be accessed by driving through Reclamation's gate on Date Street and parking in front of or near the large, beige building marked "1300." Directional signs will be posted.
