Explanation Change from PFY:

Impact(s) if Unfunded:

Without the proposed funding, activities by Reclamation and its contractors will not be adequately reviewed to ensure compliance with environmental policy and law, thus compromising public safety, potentially harming listed species and habitat, and improperly managing water and related resources in the public interest. A reduction in funding may result in delays to comply with the Biological Opinion, or with anticipated environmental mandates from regulatory agencies, resulting in diminished recovery efforts for listed species. Reclamation needs to be able to implement actions related to the Lower Santa Ynez Fish Management Plan and requirements relating to agreements with member units.

Explanation Change from PFY:

Out-year budget projections include re-establishment of prior level of participation needed by Reclamation which may have been reduced by earlier cutbacks. Funding needs unchanged.

Impact(s) if Unfunded:

Reduce assistance to Reclamation contractors in meeting the requirement of Reclamation Law. Reduced assistance in the development of the Water Conservation Field Service Program and water conservation activities under the RRA and Water Supply Act of 1958.

Activity Authorization:

Section 210 of the RRA of 1982 and Memorandum signed 5/3/96, Eluid L. Martinez, Commissioner: "Involvement in the Water Conservation Field Service Program (WCFSP) is not discretionary, but is a requirement of each Area Office, including the Water Supply Act of 1958. Full implementation of the program is essential for Reclamation to fulfill its responsibilities under the RRA". Article 20, Contract I75R-1802R. Reclamation Project Act of 1939-Section 6.

Administration of the Santa Barbara County Water Agency (SBCWA) long-term water service contract and the Central Coast Water Authority (CCWA) Warren Act contract. Implementation of existing provisions within existing laws and regulations. Work with California's State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) to ensure that Reclamation's water rights conform to state requirements. File petitions for change or correct applications when necessary, or investigation of water rights if additional studies are mandated by the State Water Resources Control Board.

Accounting for water delivery quantities to contractors and to the various water types with BOR WORKS or related computer program. Ensure contract compliance.

Biannual monitoring of Bradbury Dam outflow, Santa Ynez River domestic water supply wells for downstream communities and Santa Ynez River near Lompoc. Including the monitoring of USGS stream gages. Review and redesign monitoring program. Monitoring effort is mandated by SWRCB Order #D886.

Explanation Change from PFY:

Ongoing projects are being completed and no longer require the FTE previously submitted. Overall projects relevant to the current water rights order have been complete. Any new decision by the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) mandating additional studies may require additional funds in the future. Most of those studies will most likely be related to environmental and not repayment and or contract administration.

Impact(s) if Unfunded:

Violation of SWRCB issued Water Orders as amended. It is anticipated that the SWRCB will require additional studies or continue existing studies concerning fishery issues and public trust resources. Reclamation will need to comply with existing water right orders.

Reclamation law requires that we comply with State water law relating to control, appropriation, use or distribution of water. Reclamation could have limitations placed on our water rights or the rights diminished by the SWRCB if the program is not fully funded.

Activity Authorization:

SCCAO will, as a continuing activity, provide oversight to public and non-public requests to use portions of the lands associated with the Cachuma Project, including reservoir lands, easements and right-of-ways. To ensure protection of the facilities, reviews of the current and proposed uses of lands associated with those facilities will be ongoing. Resolution of identified trespass and unauthorized activities will be conducted. Reclamation is authorized and as prudent managers of the facilities, will oversee the users of the lands and associated structures. The activities will involve realty specialists and GIS specialists, and will involve providing GIS data information to allow for evaluating potential encroachment by development in Santa Barbara County and the South Coast area, in particular associated with the South Coast Conduit. Reclamation will work with its managing partners to facilitate quality public recreation, and to coordinate recreation activities and requirements with operational activities and requirements.

Explanation Change from PFY:

Out-year budget projections assume re-establishment of prior work schedule and level of participation by Reclamation reduced by earlier cutbacks.

Impact(s) if Unfunded:

Compliance with environmental land management requirements, including control of trash dumping, storm water runoff and erosion, etc. on federal property will be further exacerbated. The ability to resolve trespass issues, issue and maintain licenses, permits, and other agreements will be eliminated or severely reduced. Planning for efficient and cost effective land management will result in an increased number of emergency responses to critical problems at higher costs.

SCCAO will, as a continuing activity, develop and implement resource protection plans for (1) fire suppression, (2) non-operational waste and hazardous materials management, and (3) soil and moisture conservation. Fire suppression will involve placing first-responder fire protection facilities and equipment at appropriate locations to ensure public safety and protect Reclamation's land resources from wildfires. Vegetation management programs and prescribed burns will be implemented to manage fuel loads to enhance wildlife habitat, improve recreational opportunities, and to reduce the risk of wildfire. Activities will also include the evaluation and disposal of non-operational waste and hazardous materials on non-operational Reclamation lands. Programs to manage and discourage waste and hazardous material dumping on Federal property will also be implemented. Soil and moisture conservation programs will address issues related to water quality and erosion. The activities will include identification and correction of soil erosion and water quality problems associated with Reclamation lands managed for non-operational uses. Soil and moisture conservation will be furthered through the development and implementation of watershed management strategies. The primary goal of this activity is to protect the public's health and safety through the reduction of wildfire risk, management of waste and hazardous materials, improved water quality, and reduced soil erosion.

Explanation Change from PFY:

Out-year budget projections assume re-establishment of prior work schedule and level of participation by Reclamation reduced by earlier cutbacks.

Impact(s) if Unfunded:

Public Health and Safety will be jeopardized. Reclamation will be unable to provide low cost fire protection, and manage erosion and water quality to meet NPDES requirements. (NPDES requirements are those associated with runoff and erosion control from recreational areas).

Reclamation has a responsibility to conduct reviews and evaluations of its facilities and programs of its managing partners, concessionaires, and others that receive government benefits to ensure that said facilities and programs meet certain accessibility standards through training, upgrading of facilities, and implementation of new design standards. Staff in the SCCAO will serve as the lead in implementing this program. After the first year start-up, annual expenses will increase and plateau before declining to accommodate installation of required facilities.

Satisfying the Commissioner's goal of making reservoirs compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requires ADA compliant equipment, i.e. picnic tables, restrooms, fire pits, showers, telephones. Pathways need grading and paving to reduce slopes to 2% or less. ADA compliant benches, picnic tables, drinking fountains and vending machines are needed, as well as updating or adding the appropriate signage to indicate handicap facilities. The doors and hallways of the buildings need to be expanded to accommodate wheelchairs.

Based on a survey performed by technological services in Denver, CO, a total cost of \$18.4 million is needed to resolve ADA deficiencies.

Explanation Change from PFY:

Prior reduction in request has delayed meeting the Commissioner's 2010 goal, to beyond 2020. Request is minimum needed to meet the goal by 2022.

Impact(s) if Unfunded:

Not meeting ADA requirements will be a liability for Reclamation. The State of California has been involved in ADA compliance liabilities, leading to costly settlements exceeding \$500,000,000.

The improvements to the Sewage and Water Treatment systems at Lake Cachuma began in FY06 with a Congressional write-in that provided the funds necessary to begin the project. These facilities are required because the current systems are outdated and marginally adequate to meet today's treatment standards. Failure to continue the project to its completion increases the risk of a system failure which could endanger the more than 700,000 visitors to the recreation area. In addition to resolving public health and safety issues, the system improvements will also reduce the potential for in-stream discharges of partially treated sewage which could affect the anadromous fish population which the National Marine Fisheries Service is attempting to reestablish on the Santa Ynez River.

The total cost for these and related systems is estimated at approximately \$12,000,000 of which the County of Santa Barbara has been able to identify nearly \$4,000,000 in cost share. The project will be implemented using Cooperative Agreements with the County to gain access to the expertise of County staff and to facilitate cost sharing.

Explanation Change from PFY:

Out-year budget projections assume re-establishment of prior work schedule and level of participation by Reclamation reduced by earlier cutbacks.

Impact(s) if Unfunded:

More than 700,000 visitors to Lake Cachuma recreation area as well as newly established anadromous fish populations could be seriously affected by inadequately treated water, insufficient fire suppression and discharge of partially treated sewage to surface waters of the US. Reclamation will be unable to assist Santa Barbara County with these needed improvements, unless, as in previous years, a Congressional write-in is provided within the Appropriations Bill.
