Biological Opinion History

- 2008/2009
 - Reclamation provided BA to Services
 - FWS and NMFS issued jeopardy BOs
 - Reclamation provisionally accepted both FWS and NMFS BOs

- 2011
 - District court remanded Services' BOs
 - District court ordered Reclamation to complete NEPA

 - 12/1/13 Publish Final EIS
- National Marine Fisheries Service
 - 10/1/14 NMFS issues Draft BO
 - 4/1/15 Publish Draft EIS

 - 2/1/16 NMFS issues Final BO
 - 4/29/16 Sign ROD

Why the RSE Process

- Section 7 process is typically between Action Agency and the Services
- Request for a more open and inclusive process
- Reclamation committed to a more open process
- RSE process formed
- RSE process document

RSE Process Commitments

- Use a structured-facilitated process that is
 - Balanced
 - Objective
 - Open
 - Appropriately transparent
- Allow for input by stakeholders

RSE Process Participants

- DWR as applicant
- Invited Stakeholders
 - Water agencies
 - Fishing and Environmental interests
- Resource Agencies
 - FWS
 - NMFS
 - DFG

RSE Process Structure

- Not a "single" meeting table
- Management and technical-level engagement
- Allows for individual input from each invited stakeholder
- Information will be posted
- Multiple opportunities for input

Remand Consultation Package

- Action to be consulted upon
- Updated scientific information
- Updated effects analysis

Action to be Consulted Upon

- Project operations
- Structural modifications to facilities
- Offsetting measures
 - Habitat restoration
 - Other stressors

 - Provide outside science review
- Paper describing process is being developed

Draft Science Review Paper

- Identification of core scientific issues
- Review of issues by Reclamation retained experts
- Option for independent science review

Major Science Review Issues

- Schedule constraints
 - Collaboration vs. input
 - Federal procurement limitations
- Defining core scientific issues
- Selection of Reclamation retained experts
 - Criteria for selection
 - Association with interested parties
- Role of Reclamation retained experts
- Retained experts vs. independent review
