Boeger Tract Riparian Habitat Restoration The Nature Conservancy	The goals are to: (1) complete project modeling and permitting; (2) replace 51 acres of flood-prone agricultural land with native riparian habitat; and (3) use acoustic monitoring to collect baseline data on riparian songbird species.	**\$60,000 Added to the 2020 grant agreement to cover increased costs for goal (1)
Young Ranch Serpentine Habitat Acquisition on Coyote Ridge Santa Clara Valley Habitat Agency	Acquisition of six parcels totaling 2,150 acres including 670 acres of serpentine grassland habitat supporting bay checkerspot butterflies and their critical habitat, Metcalf Canyon jewelflower, Santa Clara Valley dudleya, CA tiger salamander and CA redlegged frog.	**\$400,000 Completes funding toward the \$1,000,000 grant awarded in FY2021
Continued Recovery Actions for California Red-legged Frog and California Tiger Salamander in Contra Costa County Contra Costa Resource Conservation District	Would restore three livestock ponds that provide breeding habitat for the federally listed CA red-legged frog and CA tiger salamander. The ponds have filled with sediment from natural erosive processes. They would be restored by removing sediment and extending their hydroperiod, thereby increasing habitat availability during the breeding season.	**\$150,000
