<i>Elgorriaga Ranch Conservation Easement Acquisition Project</i> California Rangeland Trust	Purchase of a conservation easement on the 5,573-acre ranch to protect San Joaquin Valley floor rangeland habitats in the Ciervo-Panoche region of western Fresno County. Species to benefit include San Joaquin kit fox, giant kangaroo rat, blunt-nosed leopard lizard, San Joaquin woolly threads, and Hoover's woolly star.	\$500,000 Combined with FY 2023 and prior year funds, this will complete the \$1,000,000 acquisition
<i>Large-flowered Fiddleneck (Amsinckia grandiflora) Conservation Easement Acquisition Project, Dirrane Ranch</i> Vollmar Natural Lands Consulting	To acquire a 120-acre conservation easement at the Dirrane Ranch. Its protection will ensure that fiddleneck successfully reintroduced to the ranch starting in 2016 through the Central Valley Conservation Program are permanently conserved and appropriately managed. The conservation easement will benefit large-flowered fiddleneck, California tiger salamander, California red-legged frog, and Alameda whipsnake.	\$224,086
<i>Riparian Habitat Restoration Benefiting Yellow-Billed Cuckoo and Valley Elderberry Longhorn Beetle at Llano Seco Riparian Sanctuary, Sacramento River National Wildlife Refuge</i> River Partners	To support the restoration of 400 acres of riparian habitat at the Llano Seco Riparian Sanctuary Unit of the Sacramento River National Wildlife Refuge. Will benefit western yellow-billed cuckoo, valley elderberry longhorn beetle, and other riparian associated wildlife.	\$564,914
