CONTRACT BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND LAKE CALIFORNIA PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC., DIVERTER OF WATER FROM SACRAMENTO RIVER SOURCES, SETTLING WATER RIGHTS DISPUTES AND PROVIDING FOR PROJECT WATER

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13	THIS CONTRACT, hereinafter referred to as "Settlement Contract," is entered into by
14	THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, hereinafter referred to as the United States, made this
15	day of, 2003, pursuant to the applicable authority granted to it generally in
16	the Act of June 17, 1902 (32 Stat. 388), and acts amendatory or supplementary thereto, including, but
17	not limited to, the Acts of August 26, 1937 (50 Stat. 844), as amended and supplemented, August 4,
18	1939 (53 Stat. 1187), as amended and supplemented, including but not limited to Sections 9 and 14
19	thereto, July 2, 1956 (70 Stat. 483), June 21, 1963 (77 Stat. 68), October 12, 1982 (96 Stat. 1262),
20	October 27, 1986 (100 Stat. 3050), as amended, and Title XXXIV of the Act of October 30, 1992
21	(106 Stat. 4706), all collectively hereinafter referred to as Federal Reclamation law, and LAKE
22	CALIFORNIA PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC., hereinafter referred to as the
23	Contractor, a corporation, acting pursuant to Sections 12003 and 12004 of the California Water Code,
24	with its principal place of business in California;
25	WITNESSETH, that:

1	EXPLANATORY RECITALS
2	[1 ^{st]} WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and is operating the Central Valley
3	Project, California, for multiple purposes pursuant to its statutory authority; and
4	[2 ^{nd]} WHEREAS, the Contractor has rights to divert, is diverting, and will continue to
5	divert for reasonable beneficial use, water from the natural flow of the Sacramento River and
6	tributaries thereto, that would have been flowing therein if the Central Valley Project were not in
7	existence; and
8	[3 ^{rd]} WHEREAS, the construction and operation of the integrated and coordinated Central
9	Valley Project has changed and will further change the regimen of the Sacramento, American, San
10	Joaquin, and Trinity Rivers and the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta from unregulated flow to
11	regulated flow; and
12	[4 th] WHEREAS, the United States has rights to divert, is diverting, and will continue to
13	divert waters from said Rivers and said Delta in connection with the operation of said Central Valley
14	Project; and
15	[5 th] WHEREAS, the Contractor and the United States had a dispute over the respective
16	rights of the parties to divert and use water from the regulated flow of the Sacramento River which
17	threatened to result in litigation, and as a means to settle that dispute entered into Contract No. 14-06
18	200-4961A, as amended, hereinafter referred to as the Existing Contract, which established terms for
19	the delivery to the Contractor of Central Valley Project Water, and the quantities of Base Supply the
20	United States and the Contractor agreed may be diverted by the Contractor from the Sacramento
21	River pursuant to such contract; and
22	[6 th] WHEREAS, the United States and the Contractor disagree with respect to the
23	authority of the United States to change the quantities of Base Supply and/or Project Water specified

as available for diversion in this Settlement Contract from the quantities specified in the Existing

1 Contract, and other issues related thereto. That dispute was the subject of litigation in a lawsuit 2 entitled Glenn-Colusa Irrigation District, et al. v. United States, et al. [Civ. No. S-01-1816 GEB/JFM 3 (E.D. Cal.)], but that litigation was dismissed, without prejudice, pursuant to a stipulation of 4 dismissal filed by the parties thereto on August 29, 2002. Notwithstanding that dismissal, the 5 Contractor and the United States enter into this Settlement Contract to renew the Existing Contract, 6 pursuant to the terms of the Existing Contract, Federal Reclamation law, and the laws of the State of 7 California; and [7^{th]} WHEREAS, to assure the Contractor of the enjoyment and use of the regulated flow 8 9 of the said Rivers and the Delta, and to provide for the economical operation of the Central Valley 10 Project by, and the reimbursement to, the United States for expenditures made for said Project. 11 NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the performance of the herein contained provisions, 12 conditions, and covenants, it is agreed as follows: 13 **DEFINITIONS** 14 1. When used herein, unless otherwise expressed or incompatible with the intent hereof, 15 the term: 16 "Base Supply" shall mean the quantity of Surface Water established in Articles (a) 17 3 and 5 which may be diverted by the Contractor from the Sacramento River each month during the 18 period April through October of each Year without payment to the United States for such quantities 19 diverted; 20 (b) "Basin-Wide Water Management Plan" shall mean the mutually agreeable Sacramento River Basinwide Water Management Plan, dated ______, developed by Glenn Colusa 21 22 Irrigation District, Maxwell Irrigation District, Natomas Central Mutual Water Company, Pelger 23 Mutual Water Company, Princeton-Codora Glenn Irrigation District, Provident Irrigation District,

Reclamation District 108, Sutter Mutual Water Company, Anderson-Cottonwood Irrigation District, 1 2 Meridian Farms Water Company, Reclamation District 1004, and the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation; 3 "Charges" shall mean the payments for Project Water that the Contractor is (c) 4 required to pay to the United States in addition to the "Rates" specified in this Settlement Contract. 5 The Contracting Officer will, on an annual basis, determine the extent of these Charges. The type 6 and amount of each Charge shall be specified in Exhibit D; 7 (d) "Contract Total" shall mean the sum of the Base Supply and Project Water 8 available for diversion by the Contractor for the period April 1 through October 31; 9 (e) "Critical Year" shall mean any Year in which either of the following 10 eventualities exists: 11 (1) The forecasted full natural inflow to Shasta Lake for the current Water 12 Year, as such forecast is made by the United States on or before February 15 and reviewed as frequently thereafter as conditions and information warrant, is equal to or less than 3.2 million 13 14 acre-feet; or 15 (2) The total accumulated actual deficiencies below 4 million acre-feet in the immediately prior Water Year or series of successive prior Water Years each of which had 16 17 inflows of less than 4 million acre-feet, together with the forecasted deficiency for the current Water 18 Year, exceed 800,000 acre-feet. For the purpose of determining a Critical Year, the computation of inflow to Shasta 19 20 Lake shall be performed in a manner that considers the extent of upstream development above Shasta 21 Lake during the year in question, and shall be used as the full natural flow to Shasta Lake. In the event that major construction has occurred or occurs above Shasta Lake after September 1, 1963, and 22 23 which has materially altered or alters the regimen of the stream systems contributing to Shasta Lake,

the computed inflow to Shasta Lake used to define a Critical Year will be adjusted to eliminate the

- 1 effect of such material alterations. After consultation with the State of California, the National
- 2 Weather Service, and other recognized forecasting agencies, the Contracting Officer will select the
- 3 forecast to be used and will make the details of it available to the Contractor. The same forecasts
- 4 used by the United States for the operation of the Project shall be used to make the forecasts
- 5 hereunder;
- 6 (f) "CVPIA" shall mean the Central Valley Project Improvement Act, Title
- 7 XXXIV of the Act of October 30, 1992 (106 Stat. 4706);
- 8 (g) "Lake" shall mean the artificial recreational lake within the service area of the
- 9 Contractor having a storage capacity of about 985 acre-feet and a surface area of about 105 acres,
- generally as shown on Exhibit B attached hereto and made a part hereof;
- 11 (h) "Project" shall mean the Central Valley Project owned by the United States
- and managed by the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation;
- 13 (i) "Project Water" shall mean all Surface Water diverted or scheduled to be
- 14 diverted each month during the period April through October of each Year by the Contractor from the
- 15 Sacramento River which is in excess of the Base Supply. The United States recognizes the right of
- 16 the Contractor to make arrangements for acquisition of water from projects of others than the United
- 17 States for delivery through the Sacramento River and tributaries subject to written agreement between
- 18 Contractor and the United States as to identification of such water, which water, when so identified,
- shall not be deemed Project Water under this Settlement Contract;
- 20 (j) "Rates" shall mean the payments for Project Water determined annually by the
- 21 Contracting Officer in accordance with the then current applicable water ratesetting policies for the
- 22 Project, as described in subdivision (a) of Article 8 of this Settlement Contract;

1	(k) "Secretary" or "Contracting Officer" shall mean the Secretary of the Interior, a
2	duly appointed successor, or an authorized representative acting pursuant to any authority of the
3	Secretary and through any agency of the Department of the Interior;
4	(l) "Storage Season" shall mean the period commencing with September 1 of 1
5	year and extending through June 14 of the next year;
6	(m) "Surface Water" shall mean only those waters that are considered as surface
7	water under California law;
8	(n) "Water-use Season" shall mean the period commencing with June 15 and
9	extending through August 31 of the same year;
10	(o) "Water Year" shall mean the period commencing with October 1 of 1 year and
11	extending through September 30 of the next; and
12	(r) "Year" shall mean a calendar year.
13	TERM OF SETTLEMENT CONTRACT
14	2. (a) This Settlement Contract shall become effective April 1, 2004, and shall remain in
15	effect until and including March 31, 2044: <u>Provided</u> , that under terms and conditions mutually
16	agreeable to the parties hereto, renewals may be made for successive periods not to exceed 40 years
17	each. The terms and conditions of each renewal shall be agreed upon not later than 1 year prior to the
18	expiration of the then existing Settlement Contract.
19	(b) With respect to Project Water and the portions of this Settlement Contract
20	pertaining thereto, upon written request by the Contractor of the Secretary made not later than 1 year
21	prior to the expiration of this Settlement Contract, whenever, account being taken of the amount then
22	credited to the costs of construction of water supply works, the remaining amount of construction
23	costs of water supply work which is properly assignable for ultimate return by the Contractor as
24	established by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to (3) of Section 1 of Public Law 643 (70 Stat.

- 1 483), probably can be repaid to the United States within the term of a contract under subsection 9(d)
- of the 1939 Reclamation Project Act (53 Stat. 1187), the relevant portions of this Settlement Contract
- 3 may be converted to a contract under said subsection 9(d) upon terms and conditions mutually
- 4 agreeable to the United States and the Contractor. The Secretary shall make a determination 10 years
- 5 after the date of execution of this Settlement Contract, and every 5 years thereafter, of whether a
- 6 conversion to a contract under said subsection 9(d) can be accomplished pursuant to Public Law 643.
- 7 Notwithstanding any provision of this Settlement Contract, the Contractor reserves and shall have all
- 8 rights and benefits under Public Law 643.

WATER TO BE FURNISHED TO CONTRACTOR

- 3. (a) Subject to the conditions, limitations, and provisions hereinafter expressed, the
 Contractor is hereby entitled and authorized to divert from the Sacramento River at the locations
 shown in Exhibit A, for beneficial use within the area delineated on Exhibit B, (both Exhibits are
 attached hereto and made a part hereof), the Contract Total designated in Exhibit A, or any revision
- actioned hereto and made a part hereory, the Contract Potal designated in Emilion 11, of any 10 vision
- 14 thereof.

- 15 (b) The Contractor may divert water from the Sacramento River at a rate not to
- exceed 25 cubic feet per second from the Sacramento River into and through the Lake and back to the
- 17 Sacramento River for purposes of maintaining satisfactory water quality and temperature for
- 18 offsetting evaporation losses in order to keep the Lake full for maximum recreational and fish culture
- 19 purposes, and for refilling the Lake during the Storage Season if emptied for emergency or for
- 20 maintenance purposes. During the Storage Season, all of such diversions shall be deemed to
- 21 constitute Base Supply. During the Water-use Season, there shall be no increase in storage of the
- Lake, and it shall be deemed the quantity of water diverted but not returned to the Sacramento River,
- and thus lost by evaporation from the Lake, is Project Water in the quantity of 200 acre-feet per
- 24 Water-use Season.

1	(c) Project Water furnished by the United States under this Settlement Contract
2	shall be used by the Contractor only for offsetting evaporation losses from the Lake unless the
3	Contractor finds it desirable to fill the Lake initially during the Water-use Season. In this event the
4	water diverted to fill or refill the Lake shall be considered to be Project Water: Provided, that any
5	such diversion for storage during the Water-use Season shall be subject to prior, written approval by
6	the Contracting Officer.
7	(d) No sale, transfer, exchange, or other disposal of any of the Contract Total
8	designated in Exhibit A or the right to the use thereof for use on land other than that shown on
9	Exhibit B shall be made by the Contractor without first obtaining the written consent of the
10	Contracting Officer. Such consent will not be unreasonably withheld and a decision will be rendered
11	in a timely manner. For short-term actions that will occur within 1 year or less, the decision will be
12	rendered within 30 days after receipt of a complete written proposal. For long-term actions that will
13	occur in a period longer than 1 year, the decision will be rendered within 90 days after receipt of a

17 Endangered Species Act, and applicable rules or regulations then in effect; Provided that, such

enable the Contracting Officer to comply with the National Environmental Policy Act, the

complete written proposal. For a proposal to be deemed complete by the Contracting Officer, it must

comply with all provisions required by State and Federal law, including information sufficient to

- 18 consent does not authorize the use of Federal facilities to facilitate or effectuate the sale, transfer,
- 19 exchange or other disposal of Base Supply. Such use of Federal facilities will be the subject of a
- separate agreement to be entered into between the Contractor and Reclamation.

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(e) For the purpose of determining whether Section 3405(a)(1)(M) of the CVPIA applies to the Contractor as a transferor or transferee of Project Water, the Contracting Officer acknowledges that the Contractor is within a county, watershed, or other area of origin, as those terms

- are utilized under California law, of water that constitutes the natural flow of the Sacramento River
 and its tributaries above the confluence of the American and Sacramento Rivers.
- 3 (f) The United States assumes no responsibility for and neither it nor its officers, 4 agents, or employees shall have any liability for or on account of:
 - (1) The quality of water to be diverted by the Contractor;
 - (2) The control, carriage, handling, use, disposal, or distribution of water diverted by the Contractor outside the facilities constructed and then being operated and maintained by or on behalf of the United States;
 - (3) Claims of damage of any nature whatsoever, including but not limited to, property loss or damage, personal injury, or death arising out of or connected with the control, carriage, handling, use, disposal, or distribution of said water outside of the hereinabove referred to facilities; and
 - (4) Any damage whether direct or indirect arising out of or in any manner caused by a shortage of water whether such shortage be on account of errors in operation, drought, or unavoidable causes.

16 <u>RETURN FLOW</u>

4. Nothing herein shall be construed as an abandonment or a relinquishment by the United States of any right it may have to the use of waste, seepage, and return flow water derived from water diverted by the Contractor hereunder and which escapes or is discharged beyond the boundaries of the lands shown on Exhibit B; Provided, that this shall not be construed as claiming for the United States any right to such water which is recovered by the Contractor pursuant to California law from within the boundaries of the lands shown on Exhibit B, and which is being used pursuant to this Settlement Contract for municipal, industrial or domestic use or underground storage for the benefit of the lands shown on Exhibit B by the Contractor.

CONSTRAINTS ON THE AVAILABILITY OF WATER

5. In a Critical Year, the Contracting Officer reserves the right to reduce the (a) Contract Total shown on Exhibit A to the Contractor: Provided, that the Contractor may divert from the Sacramento River not in excess of 75 percent of the Contract Total shown on Exhibit A, subject to the installation of measurement equipment satisfactory to the Contracting Officer. The Contractor shall install, operate, and maintain this equipment at the Contractor's expense. The Contractor shall submit, by April 1 of that Critical Year, a written schedule to the Contracting Officer indicating the Contract Total to be diverted by the Contractor during each month of that Critical Year under this Settlement Contract.

(b) The amount of any overpayment by the Contractor shall, at its option, be refunded or credited upon amounts to become due to the United States from the Contractor under the provisions hereof in the ensuing Year. To the extent of such deficiency such adjustment of overpayment shall constitute the sole remedy of the Contractor.

INTEGRATED WATER MANAGEMENT AND PARTNERSHIPS

6. The Contractor and United States desire to work together to maximize the reasonable beneficial use of water for their mutual benefit. As a consequence, the United States and the Contractor will work in partnership and with others within the Sacramento Valley, including other Contractors, to facilitate the better integration within the Sacramento Valley of all water supplies including, but not limited to, the better management and integration of surface water and groundwater, the development and better utilization of surface water storage, the effective utilization of waste, seepage and return flow water, and other operational and management options that may be identified in the future.

USE OF WATER FURNISHED TO CONTRACTOR

1	USE OF WATER FURNISHED TO CONTRACTOR
2	7. (a) Project Water furnished to the Contractor pursuant to this Settlement Contract
3	shall not be delivered or furnished by the Contractor for any purposes other than municipal,
4	industrial, and domestic purposes without the written consent of the Contracting Officer.
5	(b) The Contractor shall comply with requirements applicable to the Contractor in
6	biological opinion(s) prepared as a result of a consultation regarding the execution of this Settlement
7	Contract undertaken pursuant to Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended, that
8	are within the Contractor's legal authority to implement. The Contractor shall comply with the
9	limitations or requirements imposed by environmental documentation applicable to the Contractor
10	and within its legal authority to implement. The Existing Contract, which evidences in excess of 40
11	years of diversions, for municipal, industrial, and domestic uses, of the quantities of water provided
12	for in Article 3, and the underlying water rights of the Contractor will be considered in developing an
13	appropriate base-line for the Biological Assessment prepared pursuant to the Endangered Species
14	Act, and in any other needed environmental review. Nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the
15	Contractor from challenging or seeking judicial relief in a court of competent jurisdiction with
16	respect to any biological opinion or other environmental documentation referred to in this Article.
17	RATE AND METHOD OF PAYMENT FOR WATER
18	8. (a) The Contractor shall make payments to the United States as provided in this
19	Article for the total quantity of Project Water shown on Exhibit A each Year.
20	Such payments shall be at Rates and Charges established in accordance with: (i) the
21	Secretary's then current ratesetting policies for the Project; and (ii) applicable Reclamation law and
22	associated rules and regulations, or policies. The Rates and Charges applicable to the Contractor

upon execution of this Settlement Contract are set forth in Exhibit D, as may be revised annually.

1 The Secretary's ratesetting policies for the Project shall be amended, modified, or superseded only 2 through a public notice and comment procedure. 3 (b) The Contracting Officer shall notify the Contractor of the Rates and Charges as 4 follows: 5 (1) Prior to July 1 of each Year, the Contracting Officer shall 6 provide the Contractor an estimate of the Charges for Project Water that will be applied to the period 7 October 1, of the current Year, through September 30, of the following Year, and the basis for such 8 estimate. The Contractor shall be allowed not less than 2 months to review and comment on such 9 estimates. On or before September 15 of each Year, the Contracting Officer shall notify the 10 Contractor in writing of the Charges to be in effect during the period October 1 of the current Year, 11 through September 30, of the following Year, and such notification shall revise Exhibit D. 12 (2) Prior to October 1 of each Year, the Contracting Officer shall make available to the Contractor an estimate of the Rates for Project Water for the following Year and the 13 14 computations and cost allocations upon which those Rates are based. The Contractor shall be 15 allowed not less than 2 months to review and comment on such computations and cost allocations. 16 By December 31 of each Year, the Contracting Officer shall provide the Contractor with the final 17 Rates to be in effect for the upcoming Year, and such notification shall revise Exhibit D. 18 (c) The Contractor shall pay the United States for Project Water in the following 19 manner: 20 (1) With respect to Rates and Charges, on or before May 1 of each Year, 21 the Contractor shall pay the United States one-half the total amount payable pursuant to subdivision 22 (a) of this Article and the remainder shall be paid on or before July 1 or such later date or dates as 23 may be specified by the United States in a written notice to the Contractor.

1	(2) The amount to be paid on or before May 1 of each Year shall be based
2	on a written estimate, provided to the Contracting Officer by the Contractor on or before April 1 of
3	each Year, of the total area to be irrigated during the ensuing irrigation season.
4	(3) The amount to be paid on or before July 1 shall be equal to the
5	difference between the amount paid on May 1 and the total amount due for the Year, based on the
6	total area actually irrigated prior to July 1.
7	(4) In the event of initial filling or of refilling the Lake during the
8	Water-use Season as provided in Article 3(c), the Project Water diverted to fill or refill the Lake
9	shall be paid for in advance of such diversion at the Rates and Charges shown in Exhibit D.
10	(d) Payments to be made by the Contractor to the United States under this
11	Settlement Contract may be paid from any revenues available to the Contractor.
12	(1) All revenues received by the United States from the Contractor relating
13	to the delivery of Project Water or the delivery of non-Project Water through Project facilities shall
14	be allocated and applied in accordance with Federal Reclamation law and the associated rules or
15	regulations, and the then current Project ratesetting policies for municipal, industrial and domestic
16	water.
17	(e) The Contracting Officer shall keep its accounts pertaining to the administration
18	of the financial terms and conditions of its long-term water service and Settlement Contracts, in
19	accordance with applicable Federal standards, so as to reflect the application of Project costs and
20	revenues. The Contracting Officer shall, each Year upon request of the Contractor, provide to the
21	Contractor a detailed accounting of all Project and Contractor expense allocations, the disposition of
22	all Project and Contractor revenues, and a summary of all water delivery information. The
23	Contracting Officer and the Contractor shall enter into good faith negotiations to resolve any

discrepancies or disputes relating to accountings, reports, or information.

Settlement Contract is their mutual goal. Recognizing that experience has demonstrated that mechanisms, policies, and procedures used for establishing Rates and Charges and/or for making and allocating payments, other than those set forth in this Article may be in the mutual best interest of the parties, it is expressly agreed that the parties may enter into agreements to modify the mechanisms, policies, and procedures for any of those purposes while this Settlement Contract is in effect without amendment of this Settlement Contract.

- (g) For the term of this Settlement Contract, Rates under the respective ratesetting policies for the Project will be established to recover only reimbursable operation and maintenance (including any deficits) and capital costs of the Project, as those terms are used in the then-current Project ratesetting policies, and interest, where appropriate, except in instances where a minimum Rate is applicable in accordance with the relevant Project ratesetting policy. Proposed changes of significance in practices which implement the ratesetting policies for the Project will not be implemented until the Contracting Officer has provided the Contractor an opportunity to discuss the nature, need, and impact of the proposed change. The Contractor retains all rights to challenge the validity of Rates and Charges imposed pursuant to this Settlement Contract, including but not limited to operation and maintenance expenses and operation and maintenance deficits, in an appropriate administrative or judicial proceeding.
- (h) Except as provided in subsection 3405(a)(1)(B) of the CVPIA, the Rates for Project Water transferred, exchanged, or otherwise disposed of, by the Contractor shall be the Contractor's Rates adjusted upward or downward to reflect the changed costs of delivery (if any) of the transferred, exchanged, or otherwise disposed of Project Water to the transferree's point of delivery in accordance with the then-current ratesetting policies for the Project. Except as provided in subsection 3407(d)(2)(A) of the CVPIA, the Charges for Project Water transferred, exchanged, or

otherwise disposed of, by the Contractor shall be the Contractor's Charges specified in Exhibit D. If

2 the Contractor is receiving lower Rates and Charges because of inability to pay and is transferring,

exchanging, or otherwise disposing of Project Water to another entity whose Rates and Charges are

not adjusted due to inability to pay, the Rates and Charges for transferred, exchanged, or otherwise

disposed of Project Water shall be the Contractor's Rates and Charges unadjusted for ability to pay.

(i) Pursuant to the Act of October 27, 1986 (100 Stat. 3050), the Contracting Officer is authorized to adjust determinations of ability to pay every 5 years.

shall be made at the office of the Bureau of Reclamation, Mid-Pacific Region, File No. 11546, P.O. Box 6000, San Francisco, California 94160-1546, or at such other place as the United States may designate in a written notice to the said Contractor. Payments shall be made by cash transaction, wire, or any other mechanism as may be agreed to in writing by the Contractor and the Contracting Officer. In event there should be a default in the payment of the amount due, the delinquent payment provisions of Article 13 shall apply. The Contractor shall not be relieved of the whole or any part of its said obligation by, on account of, or notwithstanding, as the case may be its failure, refusal, or neglect to divert the quantity of Project Water shown on Exhibit A.

AGREEMENT ON WATER QUANTITIES

(a) During the term of this Settlement Contract and any renewals thereof:

(1) It shall constitute full agreement as between the United States and the Contractor as to the quantities of water and the allocation thereof between Base Supply and Project Water which may be diverted by the Contractor from the Sacramento River for beneficial use on the land shown on Exhibit B which said diversion, use, and allocation shall not be disturbed so long as the Contractor shall fulfill all of its obligations hereunder;

Neither party shall claim any right against the other in conflict with the provisions of Article 9(a)(1) hereof.

- against others than the United States or of the United States against any person other than the Contractor: Provided, however, that in the event the Contractor, the United States, or any other person shall become a party to a general adjudication of rights to the use of water of the Sacramento River system, this Settlement Contract shall not jeopardize the rights or position of either party hereto or of any other person and the rights of all such persons in respect to the use of such water shall be determined in such proceedings the same as if this Settlement Contract had not been entered into, and if final judgment in any such general adjudication shall determine that the rights of the parties hereto are different from the rights as assumed herein, the parties shall negotiate an amendment to give effect to such judgment. - (c) In the event that the California State Water Resources Control Board or a court of competent jurisdiction issues a final decision or order modifying the terms and conditions of the water rights of either party to this Settlement Contract in order to impose Bay-Delta water quality obligations, the Contractor and the United States shall promptly meet to determine whether or not to modify any of the terms of this Settlement Contract to comply with the final decision or order, including, but not limited to, the applicability of the rescheduling charge in Article 3(c)(1) of this Settlement Contract. If within 60 days of the date of the issuance of the final decision or order the parties are not able to reach agreement regarding either the need to modify this Settlement Contract
