10 INTERIM RENEWAL CONTRACT BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES  
11 AND  
12 SHASTA COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT  
13 PROVIDING FOR PROJECT WATER SERVICE

14 THIS CONTRACT, made this 27<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2004, in  
15 pursuance generally of the Act of June 17, 1902 (32 Stat. 388), and acts amendatory or supplementary  
16 thereto, including, but not limited to, the acts of August 26, 1937 (50 Stat. 844), as amended and  
17 supplemented, August 4, 1939 (53 Stat. 1187), as amended and supplemented, July 2, 1956 (70 Stat.  
18 483), June 21, 1963 (77 Stat. 68), October 12, 1982 (96 Stat. 1263), as amended and Title XXXIV of  
19 the Act of October 30, 1992 (106 Stat. 4706), all collectively hereinafter referred to as Federal  
20 Reclamation law, between THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, hereinafter referred to as the  
21 United States, and SHASTA COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT, hereinafter referred to as the  
22 Contractor, a public agency of the State of California, duly organized, existing, and acting pursuant to  
23 the laws thereof, with its principal place of business in Shasta, California;

24 WITNESSETH, That:

25 EXPLANATORY RECITALS

26 WHEREAS, the United States and the Contractor entered into an interim renewal  
27 contract identified as Contract No. 14-06-200-862A-IR1, hereinafter referred to as the Interim  
28 Renewal Contract, which provided for the continued water service to the Contractor following  
29 expiration of Contract No. 14-06-200-862A; and

30 WHEREAS, the United States and the Contractor have entered into successive renewals of  
31 the Interim Renewal Contract, the most recent of which is Contract No. 14-06-200-862A-IR1, hereinafter  
32 referred to as the Existing Interim Renewal Contract from March 1, 2003, through February 29, 2004; and

33 WHEREAS, the United States and the Contractor have made significant progress in their  
34 negotiations of a long-term renewal contract, believe that further negotiations on the long-term renewal  
35 contract would be beneficial, and mutually commit to continue to negotiate to seek to reach agreement,  
36 but anticipate that the environmental documentation necessary for execution of any long-term renewal  
37 contract will be delayed at least an additional 7 months, and may be delayed further for reasons beyond  
38 the control of the parties; and

39 WHEREAS, the Contractor has requested a subsequent interim renewal contract pursuant  
40 to Subdivision (b)(1) of Article 2 of the Interim Renewal Contract and Article 1 of the Existing Interim  
41 Renewal Contract; and

42 WHEREAS, the United States has determined that the Contractor has to date fulfilled all  
43 of its obligations under the Existing Interim Renewal Contract; and

44 WHEREAS, the United States is willing to renew the Existing Interim Renewal Contract  
45 pursuant to the terms and conditions set forth below;

46 NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual and dependent covenants herein  
47 contained, it is hereby mutually agreed by the parties hereto as follows:

48 INCORPORATION AND REVISION OF EXISTING INTERIM RENEWAL CONTRACT

49 1. The terms and conditions of the Existing Interim Renewal Contract are hereby  
50 incorporated by reference into this Contract with the same force and effect as if they were included in full  
51 text with the exception of Article 1 thereof, which is revised as follows:

52 (a) The first sentence in Subdivision (a) of Article 1 of the Existing Interim  
53 Renewal Contract is modified as follows: "This interim renewal contract shall be effective from March 1,  
54 2004, and shall remain in effect through February 28, 2006, and thereafter will be renewed as described in  
55 Subdivision (a) of Article 2 of the Interim Renewal Contract if a long-term renewal contract has not been

56 executed with an effective commencement date of March 1, 2006; Provided, that if a long-term renewal  
57 contract has been executed with an effective commencement date of March 1, 2005, this interim renewal  
58 contract shall expire on February 28, 2005."

59 (b) Subdivision (b) of Article 1 of the Existing Interim Renewal Contract is  
60 amended by deleting the date "February 15, 2004," and replacing same with the date  
61 "February 15, 2006."

62 (c) Subdivision (c) of Article 1 of the Existing Interim Renewal Contract is  
63 amended by deleting the dates "February 1, 2004," "February 15, 2004," and "February 29, 2004," and  
64 replacing same with the dates "February 1, 2006," "February 15, 2006," and "February 28, 2006,"  
65 respectively.
