17	THIS CONTRACT, hereinafter referred to as "Settlement Contract," is entered into
18	by THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, hereinafter referred to as the United States, made
19	this day of, 2004, pursuant to the applicable authority granted to
20	it generally in the Act of June 17, 1902 (32 Stat. 388), and acts amendatory or supplementary
21	thereto, including, but not limited to, the Acts of August 26, 1937 (50 Stat. 844), as amended and
22	supplemented, August 4, 1939 (53 Stat. 1187), as amended and supplemented, including, but not
23	limited to, Sections 9 and 14 thereto, July 2, 1956 (70 Stat. 483), June 21, 1963 (77 Stat. 68),
24	October 12, 1982 (96 Stat. 1262), October 27, 1986 (100 Stat. 3050), as amended, and Title
25	XXXIV of the Act of October 30, 1992 (106 Stat. 4706), all collectively hereinafter referred to
26	as Federal Reclamation law, and NATOMAS CENTRAL MUTUAL WATER COMPANY,
27	hereinafter referred to as the Contractor, a corporation, acting pursuant to Sections 12003 and
28	12004 of the California Water Code, with its principal place of business in California;
29	WITNESSETH, that:

1 EXPLANATORY RECITALS [1^{st]} 2 WHEREAS, the United States has constructed and is operating the Central Valley 3 Project, California, for multiple purposes pursuant to its statutory authority; and $[2^{nd}]$ 4 WHEREAS, the Contractor has rights to divert, is diverting, and will continue to 5 divert for reasonable beneficial use, water from the natural flow of the Sacramento River and 6 tributaries thereto, that would have been flowing therein if the Central Valley Project were not in 7 existence; [3^{rd]} 8 WHEREAS, the construction and operation of the integrated and coordinated 9 Central Valley Project has changed and will further change the regimen of the Sacramento, 10 American, San Joaquin, and Trinity Rivers and the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta from 11 unregulated flow to regulated flow; and $[4^{\text{th}}]$ WHEREAS, the United States has rights to divert, is diverting, and will continue 12 13 to divert waters from said Rivers and said Delta in connection with the operation of said Central 14 Valley Project; and $[5^{\text{th}}]$ WHEREAS, the Contractor and the United States had a dispute over the 15 16 respective rights of the parties to divert and use water from the regulated flow of the Sacramento 17 River which threatened to result in litigation, and as a means to settle that dispute entered into 18 Contract No. 14-06-200-885A, as revised, hereinafter referred to as the Existing Contract, which 19 established terms for the delivery to the Contractor of Central Valley Project Water, and the 20 quantities of Base Supply the United States and the Contractor agreed may be diverted by the 21 Contractor from the Sacramento River pursuant to such contract; and $[6^{\text{th}}]$ WHEREAS, the United States and the Contractor disagree with respect to the 22 23 authority of the United States to change the quantities of Base Supply and/or Project Water

1	specified as available for diversion in this Settlement Contract from the quantities specified in
2	the Existing Contract, and other issues related thereto. That dispute was the subject of litigation
3	in a lawsuit entitled Glenn-Colusa Irrigation District, et al. v. United States, et al. [Civ. No. S-
4	01-1816 GEB/JFM (E.D. Cal.)], but that litigation was dismissed, without prejudice, pursuant to
5	a stipulation of dismissal filed by the parties thereto on August 29, 2002. Notwithstanding that
6	dismissal, the Contractor and the United States enter into this Settlement Contract to renew the
7	Existing Contract, pursuant to the terms of the Existing Contract, Federal Reclamation law, and
8	the laws of the State of California; and
9	[7 ^{th]} WHEREAS, to assure the Contractor of the enjoyment and use of the regulated
10	flow of the said Rivers and the Delta, and to provide for the economical operation of the Central
11	Valley Project by, and the reimbursement to, the United States for expenditures made for said
12	Project.
13	NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the performance of the herein contained
14	provisions, conditions, and covenants, it is agreed as follows:
15	DEFINITIONS
16	1. When used herein, unless otherwise expressed or incompatible with the intent
17	hereof, the term:
18	(a) "Base Supply" shall mean the quantity of Surface Water established in
19	Articles 3 and 5 which may be diverted by the Contractor from the Sacramento River each month
20	during the period April through October of each Year without payment to the United States for
21	such quantities diverted;
22	(b) "Basin-Wide Water Management Plan" shall mean the mutually agreeable
23	Sacramento River Basinwide Water Management Plan, dated, developed by

1	Glenn-Colusa Irrigation District, Maxwell Irrigation District, Natomas Central Mutual Water
2	Company, Pelger Mutual Water Company, Princeton-Codora-Glenn Irrigation District, Provident
3	Irrigation District, Reclamation District 108, Sutter Mutual Water Company, Anderson-
4	Cottonwood Irrigation District, M&T, Inc., Meridian Farms Water Company, Reclamation
5	District 1004, and the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation;
6	(c) "Charges" shall mean the payments for Project Water that the Contractor
7	is required to pay to the United States in addition to the "Rates" specified in this Settlement
8	Contract. The Contracting Officer will, on an annual basis, determine the extent of these
9	Charges. The type and amount of each Charge shall be specified in Exhibit D;
10	(d) "Contract Total" shall mean the sum of the Base Supply and Project Water
11	available for diversion by the Contractor for the period April 1 through October 31;
12	(e) "Critical Year" shall mean any Year in which either of the following
13	eventualities exists:
14	(1) The forecasted full natural inflow to Shasta Lake for the current
15	Water Year, as such forecast is made by the United States on or before February 15 and reviewed
16	as frequently thereafter as conditions and information warrant, is equal to or less than 3.2 million
17	acre-feet; or
18	(2) The total accumulated actual deficiencies below 4 million acre-feet
19	in the immediately prior Water Year or series of successive prior Water Years each of which had
20	inflows of less than 4 million acre-feet, together with the forecasted deficiency for the current
21	Water Year, exceed 800,000 acre-feet.
22	For the purpose of determining a Critical Year, the computation of inflow to
23	Shasta Lake shall be performed in a manner that considers the extent of upstream development

1	above Shasta Lake during the year in question, and shall be used as the full natural flow to		
2	Shasta Lake. In the event that major construction has occurred or occurs above Shasta Lake after		
3	September 1, 1963, and which has materially altered or alters the regimen of the stream systems		
4	contributing to Shasta Lake, the computed inflow to Shasta Lake used to define a Critical Year		
5	will be adjusted to eliminate the effect of such material alterations. After consultation with the		
6	State of California, the National Weather Service, and other recognized forecasting agencies, the		
7	Contracting Officer will select the forecast to be used and will make the details of it available to		
8	the Contractor. The same forecasts used by the United States for the operation of the Project		
9	shall be used to make the forecasts hereunder;		
10	(f) "CVPIA" shall mean the Central Valley Project Improvement Act, Title		
11	XXXIV of the Act of October 30, 1992 (106 Stat. 4706);		
12	(g) "Eligible Lands" shall mean all lands to which Project Water may be		
13	delivered in accordance with Section 204 of the Reclamation Reform Act of October 12, 1982		
14	(96 Stat. 1263), as amended, hereinafter referred to as RRA;		
15	(h) "Excess Lands" shall mean all lands in excess of the limitations contained		
16	in Section 204 of the RRA, other than those lands exempt from acreage limitation under Federal		
17	Reclamation law;		
18	(i) "Full Cost Rate" shall mean that water rate described in Sections 205(a)(3)		
19	or 202(3) of the RRA, whichever is applicable;		
20	(j) "Ineligible Lands" shall mean all lands to which Project Water may not be		
21	delivered in accordance with Section 204 of the RRA;		
22	(k) "Landholder" shall mean a party that directly or indirectly owns or leases		
23	nonexempt land, as provided in 43 CFR 426.2;		

1	(l) "Project" shall mean the Central Valley Project owned by the United
2	States and managed by the Department of the Interior, Bureau of Reclamation;
3	(m) "Project Water" shall mean all Surface Water diverted or scheduled to be
4	diverted each month during the period April through October of each Year by the Contractor
5	from the Sacramento River which is in excess of the Base Supply. The United States recognizes
6	the right of the Contractor to make arrangements for acquisition of water from projects of others
7	than the United States for delivery through the Sacramento River and tributaries subject to
8	written agreement between Contractor and the United States as to identification of such water
9	which water when so identified shall not be deemed Project Water under this Settlement
10	Contract;
11	(n) "Rates" shall mean the payments for Project Water determined annually
12	by the Contracting Officer in accordance with the then current applicable water ratesetting
13	policies for the Project, as described in subdivision (a) of Article 8 of this Settlement Contract;
14	(o) "Secretary" or "Contracting Officer" shall mean the Secretary of the
15	Interior, a duly appointed successor, or an authorized representative acting pursuant to any
16	authority of the Secretary and through any agency of the Department of the Interior;
17	(p) "Surface Water" shall mean only those waters that are considered as
18	surface water under California law;
19	(q) "Water Year" shall mean the period commencing with October 1 of one
20	year and extending through September 30 of the next; and
21	(r) "Year" shall mean a calendar year.

TERM OF SETTLEMENT CONTRACT

2 2. (a) This Settlement Contract shall become effective April 1, 2004, and shall 3 remain in effect until and including March 31, 2044: <u>Provided</u>, that under terms and conditions 4 mutually agreeable to the parties hereto, renewals may be made for successive periods not to 5 exceed 40 years each. The terms and conditions of each renewal shall be agreed upon not later 6 than 1 year prior to the expiration of the then existing Settlement Contract.

7 With respect to Project Water and the portions of this Settlement Contract (b) 8 pertaining thereto, upon written request by the Contractor of the Secretary made not later than 1 9 year prior to the expiration of this Settlement Contract, whenever, account being taken of the 10 amount then credited to the costs of construction of water supply works, the remaining amount of 11 construction costs of water supply work which is properly assignable for ultimate return by the 12 Contractor as established by the Secretary of the Interior pursuant to (3) of Section 1 of Public 13 Law 643 (70 Stat. 483), probably can be repaid to the United States within the term of a contract 14 under subsection 9(d) of the 1939 Reclamation Project Act (53 Stat. 1187), the relevant portions 15 of this Settlement Contract may be converted to a contract under said subsection 9(d) upon terms 16 and conditions mutually agreeable to the United States and the Contractor. The Secretary shall 17 make a determination 10 years after the date of execution of this Settlement Contract, and every 18 5 years thereafter, of whether a conversion to a contract under said subsection 9(d) can be 19 accomplished pursuant to Public Law 643. Notwithstanding any provision of this Settlement 20 Contract, the Contractor reserves and shall have all rights and benefits under Public Law 643.

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WATER TO BE FURNISHED TO CONTRACTOR

3. (a) Subject to the conditions, limitations, and provisions hereinafter
expressed, the Contractor is hereby entitled and authorized to divert from the Sacramento River

1 at the locations shown in Exhibit A, for beneficial use within the area delineated on Exhibit B, 2 (both Exhibits are attached hereto and made a part hereof), the Contract Total designated in 3 Exhibit A, or any revision thereof, in accordance with the monthly operating schedule required 4 by Article 3(c) of this Settlement Contract. The quantity of any water diverted under this 5 Settlement Contract from the Sacramento River, during the period April through October, for use 6 on any lands delineated on Exhibit B, by the owner of such lands or otherwise shall constitute a 7 part of the Contract Total as shown on Exhibit A and shall be subject to all the provisions of this 8 Settlement Contract relating to such Contract Total as if such diversion were made by the 9 Contractor. 10 (b) The Contractor may have acquired rights to divert water from the 11 Sacramento River during the period April through October, that were obtained after the date of 12 execution of the Existing Contract, or the Contractor may acquire such rights in the future. All 13 diversions made from the Sacramento River, pursuant to such rights, during the period April 14 through October, shall not be considered a part of the quantity of Base Supply and Project Water 15 specified in Exhibit A; Provided, that the quantities diverted pursuant to the above rights shall be 16 identified on the schedule submitted pursuant to Article 3(c) below, and shall not be substituted 17 for any Base Supply or Project Water; Provided, further, that any such identified quantities of 18 other acquired rights may be diverted by the Contractor before incurring any fee pursuant to 19 Article 3(c)(1), below.

(c) Before April 1 and before the first day of each month thereafter when a
revision is needed, the Contractor shall submit a written schedule to the Contracting Officer
indicating the Contract Total to be diverted by the Contractor for agricultural and municipal and
industrial purposes during each month under this Settlement Contract. The United States shall

1	furnish water to the Contractor in accordance with the monthly operating schedule or any
2	revisions thereof. However, the United States recognizes the need of the Contractor to change
3	from time to time its monthly diversions of water from the quantities shown in Exhibit A; the
4	Contractor may make such changes, provided:
5	(1) that for the quantity of Base Supply diverted in excess of the
6	monthly quantity shown in Exhibit A, and as may be reduced in accordance with Article 5(a),
7	during June, July, August, September, or October of any Water Year, the Contractor shall be
8	charged a rescheduling fee equal to 50 percent of the sum of the storage operations and
9	maintenance rate and the storage capital rate components of the Project ratesetting policy.
10	(2) that in no event shall the total quantity scheduled for diversion by
11	the Contractor from the Sacramento River:
12	(i) During the period April through October exceed the
13	aggregate of the Contract Total for that period shown in Exhibit A or any revision
14	thereof;
15	(ii) During the period July through September exceed the
16	aggregate of the Contract Total for that period shown in Exhibit A or any revision
17	thereof.
18	(d) In the event conditions warrant, the Contracting Officer reserves the right
19	to require the Contractor to submit, at least 72 hours prior to the beginning of each weekly
20	period, its estimate of daily diversion requirements for each such period from the Sacramento
21	River: Provided, however, that changes during any such period may be made upon the giving of
22	72 hours' notice thereof to the Contracting Officer.

1 (e) No sale, transfer, exchange, or other disposal of any of the Contract Total 2 designated in Exhibit A or the right to the use thereof for use on land other than that shown on 3 Exhibit B shall be made by the Contractor without first obtaining the written consent of the 4 Contracting Officer. Such consent will not be unreasonably withheld and a decision will be 5 rendered in a timely manner. For short-term actions that will occur within 1 year or less, the 6 decision will be rendered within 30 days after receipt of a complete written proposal. For long-7 term actions that will occur in a period longer than 1 year, the decision will be rendered within 8 90 days after receipt of a complete written proposal. For a proposal to be deemed complete by 9 the Contracting Officer, it must comply with all provisions required by State and Federal law, 10 including information sufficient to enable the Contracting Officer to comply with the National 11 Environmental Policy Act, the Endangered Species Act, and applicable rules or regulations then 12 in effect; Provided that, such consent does not authorize the use of Federal facilities to facilitate 13 or effectuate the sale, transfer, exchange, or other disposal of Base Supply. Such use of Federal 14 facilities will be the subject of a separate agreement to be entered into between the Contractor 15 and Reclamation.

(f) For the purpose of determining whether Section 3405(a)(1)(M) of the
CVPIA applies to the Contractor as a transferor or transferee of Project Water, the Contracting
Officer acknowledges that the Contractor is within a county, watershed, or other area of origin,
as those terms are utilized under California law.

(g) Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Contractor from diverting
water during the months of November through March for beneficial use on the land shown on
Exhibit B or elsewhere to the extent authorized under the laws of the State of California.

11		(4)	Any damage whether direct or indirect arising out of or in any

15	4. Nothin	g here	in shall be construed as an abandonment or a relinquishment by the
16	United States of any r	ight it	may have to the use of waste, seepage, and return flow water derived
17	from water diverted b	y the C	Contractor hereunder and which escapes or is discharged beyond the
18	boundaries of the land	ls shov	on on Exhibit B; Provided, that this shall not be construed as
19	claiming for the Unite	d State	es any right to such water which is recovered by the Contractor
20	pursuant to California	law fr	om within the boundaries of the lands shown on Exhibit B, and
21	which is being used p	ursuan	t to this Settlement Contract for surface irrigation or underground
22	storage for the benefit	of the	lands shown on Exhibit B by the Contractor.

1	CONSTRAINTS ON THE AVAILABILITY OF WATER
2	5. (a) In a Critical Year, the Contractor's Base Supply and Project Water agreed
3	to be diverted during the period April through October of the Year in which the principal portion
4	of the Critical Year occurs and, each monthly quantity of said period shall be reduced by
5	25 percent.
6	(b) The amount of any overpayment by the Contractor shall, at its option, be
7	refunded or credited upon amounts to become due to the United States from the Contractor under
8	the provisions hereof in the ensuing Year. To the extent of such deficiency such adjustment of
9	overpayment shall constitute the sole remedy of the Contractor.
10	INTEGRATED WATER MANAGEMENT AND PARTNERSHIPS
11	6. The Contractor and United States desire to work together to maximize the
12	reasonable beneficial use of water for their mutual benefit. As a consequence, the United States
13	and the Contractor will work in partnership and with others within the Sacramento Valley,
14	including other Contractors, to facilitate the better integration within the Sacramento Valley of
15	all water supplies including, but not limited to, the better management and integration of surface
16	water and groundwater, the development and better utilization of surface water storage, the
17	effective utilization of waste, seepage and return flow water, and other operational and
18	management options that may be identified in the future.
19	USE OF WATER FURNISHED TO CONTRACTOR
20	7. (a) Project Water furnished to the Contractor pursuant to this Settlement
21	Contract shall not be delivered or furnished by the Contractor for any purposes other than
22	agricultural or municipal and industrial purposes: Provided, however, that the Contractor shall
23	not deliver or furnish Project Water for municipal and industrial purposes outside those areas

1 delineated on Exhibit B, without the written consent of the Contracting Officer. For purposes of 2 this Settlement Contract, "agricultural purposes" includes, but is not restricted to, the irrigation 3 of crops, the watering of livestock, incidental domestic use including related landscape irrigation, 4 or underground water replenishment; and "municipal and industrial purposes" includes, but is 5 not limited to, the watering of landscaping or pasture for animals (e.g., horses) which are kept for 6 personal enjoyment or water delivered to landholdings operated in units of less than 5 acres 7 unless the Contractor establishes to the satisfaction of the Contracting Officer that the use of 8 Project Water is for agricultural purposes. 9 (b) The Contractor shall comply with requirements applicable to the 10 Contractor in biological opinion(s) prepared as a result of a consultation regarding the execution 11 of this Settlement Contract undertaken pursuant to Section 7 of the Endangered Species Act of 12 1973, as amended, that are within the Contractor's legal authority to implement. The Contractor 13 shall comply with the limitations or requirements imposed by environmental documentation 14 applicable to the Contractor and within its legal authority to implement. The Existing Contract, 15 which evidences in excess of 40 years of diversions, for agricultural uses, of the quantities of 16 water provided for in Article 3, and the underlying water rights of the Contractor will be 17 considered in developing an appropriate base-line for the Biological Assessment prepared 18 pursuant to the Endangered Species Act, and in any other needed environmental review. 19 Nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the Contractor from challenging or seeking judicial 20 relief in a court of competent jurisdiction with respect to any biological opinion or other 21 environmental documentation referred to in this Article.

1	RATE AND METHOD OF PAYMENT FOR WATER
2	8. (a) The Contractor shall make payments to the United States as provided in
3	this Article for all Project Water shown in Exhibit A as follows:
4	(1) 75 percent of the amount shown as Project Water shall be paid for
5	by the Contractor in each Year; and in addition
6	(2) the Contractor shall pay for Project Water actually diverted in
7	excess of 75 percent of the amount shown as Project Water.
8	Such payments shall be at Rates and Charges established in accordance with: (i) the
9	Secretary's then-current ratesetting policies for the Project; and (ii) applicable Reclamation law
10	and associated rules and regulations, or policies: Provided, that if the Contractor desires to use
11	Project Water for other than agricultural use the Rates and Charges set forth above will be
12	adjusted by the Contracting Officer to the applicable Rates and Charges for such use: Provided,
13	further, that, prior to its initial use of Project Water for municipal and industrial purposes, the
14	Contractor shall provide the Contracting Officer with an estimated annual quantity of Project
15	Water to be diverted or furnished for municipal and industrial purposes through the end of the
16	CVP repayment period as identified in the then-current ratesetting policies. The Rates and
17	Charges applicable to the Contractor upon execution of this Settlement Contract are set forth in
18	Exhibit D, as may be revised annually. The Secretary's ratesetting policies for the Project shall
19	be amended, modified, or superseded only through a public notice and comment procedure. The
20	Contracting Officer shall adjust the amount of Project Water for which payment is required to
21	the extent of any reduction in diversions of Project Water made in accordance with the water
22	conservation provisions of Article 29(e).

(b) The Contracting Officer shall notify the Contractor of the Rates and
 Charges as follows:

3 (1) Prior to July 1 of each Year, the Contracting Officer shall provide 4 the Contractor an estimate of the Charges for Project Water that will be applied to the period 5 October 1, of the current Year, through September 30, of the following Year, and the basis for 6 such estimate. The Contractor shall be allowed not less than 2 months to review and comment 7 on such estimates. On or before September 15 of each Year, the Contracting Officer shall notify 8 the Contractor in writing of the Charges to be in effect during the period October 1 of the current 9 Year, through September 30, of the following Year, and such notification shall revise Exhibit D. 10 (2)Prior to October 1 of each Year, the Contracting Officer shall make 11 available to the Contractor an estimate of the Rates for Project Water for the following Year and 12 the computations and cost allocations upon which those Rates are based. The Contractor shall be 13 allowed not less than 2 months to review and comment on such computations and cost 14 allocations. By December 31 of each Year, the Contracting Officer shall provide the Contractor 15 with the final Rates to be in effect for the upcoming Year, and such notification shall revise 16 Exhibit D.

17 (c) The Contractor shall pay the United States for Project Water in the18 following manner:

(1) With respect to Rates, prior to May 1 of each Year, the Contractor
shall pay the United States one-half the total amount payable pursuant to subdivision (a) of this
Article and the remainder shall be paid prior to July 1 or such later date or dates as may be
specified by the United States in a written notice to the Contractor: <u>Provided</u>, <u>however</u>, that if at
any time during the Year the amount of Project Water diverted by the Contractor shall equal the

1	amount for which payment has been made, the Contractor shall pay for the remaining amount of
2	such water as shown in Exhibit A in advance of any further diversion of Project Water.
3	(2) With respect to Charges, the Contractor shall also make a payment
4	to the United States, in addition to the Rate(s) in subdivision (c)(1) of this Article, at the Charges
5	then in effect, before the end of the month following the month of delivery or transfer. The
6	payments shall be consistent with the quantities of Project Water delivered or transferred.
7	Adjustment for overpayment or underpayment of Charges shall be made through the adjustment
8	of payments due to the United States for Charges for the next month. Any amount to be paid for
9	past due payment of Charges shall be computed pursuant to Article 13 of this Settlement
10	Contract.
11	(d) Payments to be made by the Contractor to the United States under this
12	Settlement Contract may be paid from any revenues available to the Contractor.
13	(1) All revenues received by the United States from the Contractor
14	relating to the delivery of Project Water or the delivery of non-Project Water through Project
15	facilities shall be allocated and applied in accordance with Federal Reclamation law and the
16	associated rules or regulations, and the then current Project ratesetting policies for Irrigation
17	Water.
18	(e) The Contracting Officer shall keep its accounts pertaining to the
19	administration of the financial terms and conditions of its long-term water service and Settlement
20	Contracts, in accordance with applicable Federal standards, so as to reflect the application of
21	Project costs and revenues. The Contracting Officer shall, each Year upon request of the
22	Contractor, provide to the Contractor a detailed accounting of all Project and Contractor expense
23	allocations, the disposition of all Project and Contractor revenues, and a summary of all water

delivery information. The Contracting Officer and the Contractor shall enter into good faith
 negotiations to resolve any discrepancies or disputes relating to accountings, reports, or
 information.

(f) The parties acknowledge and agree that the efficient administration of this
Settlement Contract is their mutual goal. Recognizing that experience has demonstrated that
mechanisms, policies, and procedures used for establishing Rates and Charges and/or for making
and allocating payments, other than those set forth in this Article may be in the mutual best
interest of the parties, it is expressly agreed that the parties may enter into agreements to modify
the mechanisms, policies, and procedures for any of those purposes while this Settlement
Contract is in effect without amendment of this Settlement Contract.

11 (g) For the term of this Settlement Contract, Rates under the respective 12 ratesetting policies for the Project will be established to recover only reimbursable operation and 13 maintenance (including any deficits) and capital costs of the Project, as those terms are used in 14 the then current Project ratesetting policies, and interest, where appropriate, except in instances 15 where a minimum Rate is applicable in accordance with the relevant Project ratesetting policy. 16 Proposed changes of significance in practices which implement the ratesetting policies for the 17 Project will not be implemented until the Contracting Officer has provided the Contractor an 18 opportunity to discuss the nature, need, and impact of the proposed change. The Contractor 19 retains all rights to challenge the validity of Rates and Charges imposed pursuant to this 20 Settlement Contract, including but not limited to operation and maintenance expenses and 21 operation and maintenance deficits, in an appropriate administrative or judicial proceeding. 22 (h) Except as provided in subsection 3405(a)(1)(B) of the CVPIA, the Rates 23 for Project Water transferred, exchanged, or otherwise disposed of, by the Contractor shall be the

1	Contractor's Rates adjusted upward or downward to reflect the changed costs of delivery (if any)			
2	of the transferred, exchanged, or otherwise disposed of Project Water to the transferee's point of			
3	delivery in accordance with the then-current ratesetting policies for the Project. Except as			
4	provided in subsection 3407(d)(2)(A) of the CVPIA, the Charges for Project Water transferred,			
5	exchanged, or otherwise disposed of, by the Contractor shall be the Contractor's Charges			
6	specified in Exhibit D. If the Contractor is receiving lower Rates and Charges because of			
7	inability to pay and is transferring, exchanging, or otherwise disposing of Project Water to			
8	another entity whose Rates and Charges are not adjusted due to inability to pay, the Rates and			
9	Charges for transferred, exchanged, or otherwise disposed of Project Water shall be the			
10	Contractor's Rates and Charges unadjusted for ability to pay.			
11	(i) Pursuant to the Act of October 27, 1986 (100 Stat. 3050), the Contracting			
12	Officer is authorized to adjust determinations of ability to pay every 5 years.			
13	(j) Each payment to be made pursuant to subdivisions (a) and (b) of this			
14	Article shall be made at the office of the Bureau of Reclamation, Mid-Pacific Region, File			
15	No. 11546, P.O. Box 6000, San Francisco, California 94160-1546, or at such other place as the			
16	United States may designate in a written notice to the said Contractor. Payments shall be made			
17	by cash transaction, wire, or any other mechanism as may be agreed to in writing by the			
18	Contractor and the Contracting Officer. In the event there should be a default in the payment of			
19	the amount due, the delinquent payment provisions of Article 13 shall apply. The Contractor			
20	shall not be relieved of the whole or any part of its said obligation by, on account of, or			
21	notwithstanding, as the case may be:

AGREEMENT ON WATER QUANTITIES				
9. (a) During the term of this Settlement Contract and any renewals thereof:				
(1) It shall constitute full agreement as between the United States and				
the Contractor as to the quantities of water and the allocation thereof between Base Supply and				
Project Water which may be diverted by the Contractor from the Sacramento River for beneficial				
use on the land shown on Exhibit B which said diversion, use, and allocation shall not be				
disturbed so long as the Contractor shall fulfill all of its obligations hereunder;				
(2) Neither party shall claim any right against the other in conflict with				
the provisions of Article 9(a)(1) hereof.				
(b) Nothing herein contained is intended to or does limit rights of the				
Contractor against others than the United States or of the United States against any person other				
than the Contractor: Provided, however, that in the event the Contractor, the United States, or				
any other person shall become a party to a general adjudication of rights to the use of water of				
the Sacramento River system, this Settlement Contract shall not jeopardize the rights or position				
of either party hereto or of any other person and the rights of all such persons in respect to the				

1 use of such water shall be determined in such proceedings the same as if this Settlement Contract 2 had not been entered into, and if final judgment in any such general adjudication shall determine 3 that the rights of the parties hereto are different from the rights as assumed herein, the parties 4 shall negotiate an amendment to give effect to such judgment. In the event the parties are unable 5 to agree on an appropriate amendment they shall, within 60 days of determining that there is an 6 impasse, employ the services of a neutral mediator, experienced in resolving water rights 7 disputes, to assist in resolving the impasse. The cost of the mediation will be shared equally. A 8 failure to reach agreement on an amendment within 60 days of the end of mediation will cause 9 the immediate termination of this Settlement Contract.

10 In the event that the California State Water Resources Control Board or a (c) 11 court of competent jurisdiction issues a final decision or order modifying the terms and 12 conditions of the water rights of either party to this Settlement Contract in order to impose Bay-13 Delta water quality obligations, the Contractor and the United States shall promptly meet to 14 determine whether or not to modify any of the terms of this Settlement Contract to comply with 15 the final decision or order, including, but not limited to, the applicability of the rescheduling 16 charge in Article 3(c)(1) of this Settlement Contract. If within 60 days of the date of the issuance 17 of the final decision or order the parties are not able to reach agreement regarding either the need 18 to modify this Settlement Contract or the manner in which this Settlement Contract is to be 19 modified, the parties shall promptly retain a neutral mediator, experienced in resolving water 20 right disputes, to assist the parties in resolving their dispute. The cost of the mediator shall be 21 shared equally. In the event that either of the parties to this Settlement Contract determines that 22 the parties will not be able to develop mutually-agreeable modification(s) to this Settlement 23 Contract even with the assistance of a mediator, either of the parties to this Settlement Contract

1 may attempt to resolve the impasse by seeking appropriate judicial relief including, but not 2 limited to, filing a general adjudication of the rights to the use of water in the Sacramento River 3 system. The foregoing provisions of this sub-article shall only apply to the incremental 4 obligations contained within a final decision or order of the State Water Resources Control 5 Board that reflects a modification to the obligations imposed in State Water Resources Control 6 Board Revised Water Rights Decision 1641 dated March 15, 2000, and its associated 1995 Water 7 Quality Control Plan which, taken together, will be considered the baseline for the application of 8 the provisions of this sub-article.

9 (d) In the event this Settlement Contract terminates, the rights of the parties to 10 thereafter divert and use water shall exist as if this Settlement Contract had not been entered into; 11 and the fact that as a compromise settlement of a controversy as to the respective rights of the 12 parties to divert and use water and the yield of such rights during the term hereof, this Settlement 13 Contract places a limit on the Contract Total to be diverted annually by the Contractor during the 14 Settlement Contract term and segregates it into Base Supply and Project Water shall not 15 jeopardize the rights or position of either party with respect to its water rights or the yield thereof 16 at all times after the Settlement Contract terminates. It is further agreed that the Contractor at all 17 times will first use water to the use of which it is entitled by virtue of its own water rights, and 18 neither the provisions of this Settlement Contract, action taken thereunder, nor payments made 19 thereunder to the United States by the Contractor shall be construed as an admission that any part 20 of the water used by the Contractor during the term of this Settlement Contract was in fact water 21 to which it would not have been entitled under water rights owned by it nor shall receipt of 22 payments thereunder by the United States from the Contractor be construed as an admission that

1	any part of the water used by the Contractor during the term of this Settlement Contract was in				
2	fact water to which it would have been entitled under water rights owned by it.				
3	MEASUREMENT OF WATER				
4	10. (a) All water diverted by the Contractor from the Sacramento River will be				
5	diverted at the existing point or points of diversion shown on Exhibit A or at such other points as				
6	may be mutually agreed upon in writing by the Contracting Officer and the Contractor.				
7	(b) All water diverted from the Sacramento River pursuant to this Settlement				
8	Contract will be measured or caused to be measured by the United States at each point of				
9	diversion with existing equipment or equipment to be installed, operated, and maintained by the				
10	United States, and/or others, under contract with and at the option of the United States. The				
11	equipment and methods used to make such measurement shall be in accordance with sound				
12	engineering practices. Upon request of the Contractor, the accuracy of such measurements will				
13	be investigated by the Contracting Officer and any errors appearing therein will be corrected.				
14	(c) The right of ingress to and egress from all points of diversion is hereby				
15	granted to all authorized employees of the United States. The Contractor also hereby grants to				
16	the United States the right to install, operate, maintain, and replace such equipment on diversion				
17	or carriage facilities at each point of diversion as the Contracting Officer deems necessary.				
18	(d) The Contractor shall not modify, alter, remove, or replace diversion				
19	facilities or do any other act which would alter the effectiveness or accuracy of the measuring				
20	equipment installed by the United States or its representatives unless and until the Contracting				
21	Officer has been notified with due diligence and has been given an opportunity to modify such				
22	measuring equipment in such manner as may be necessary or appropriate. In the event of an				
23	emergency the Contractor shall notify the United States within a reasonable time thereafter as to				

- 1 the existence of the emergency and the nature and extent of such modification, alteration,
- 2 removal, or replacement of diversion facilities.
- 3 (e) The Contractor shall pay the United States for the costs to repair, relocate, 4 or replace measurement equipment when the Contractor modifies, alters, removes, or replaces 5 diversion or carriage facilities. 6 (f) Contractor and Contracting Officer shall develop a mutually agreeable 7 surface water delivery water measurement program which shall be implemented by the 8 Contractor, and such measurement program shall be consistent with the conservation and 9 efficiency criteria for evaluating water conservation plans as provided in Article 29(a). 10 All new surface water delivery systems installed within the lands (g) 11 delineated on Exhibit B after the effective date of this Settlement Contract shall also comply with 12 the measurement provisions described in this Article. The Contractor shall inform the Contracting Officer on or before the 10th 13 (h) calendar day of each month of the quantity of Contract Total diverted or furnished for 14 15 agricultural and municipal and industrial purposes during the preceding month. 16 **RULES AND REGULATIONS** 17 11. The parties agree that the delivery of Project Water for irrigation use or use of 18 Federal facilities pursuant to this Settlement Contract is subject to Federal Reclamation law, including but not limited to, the Reclamation Reform Act of 1982 (43 U.S.C. 390aa et seq.), as 19 20 amended and supplemented, and the rules and regulations promulgated by the Secretary of the 21 Interior under Federal Reclamation law. 22 GENERAL OBLIGATION--BENEFITS CONDITIONED UPON PAYMENT 23 12. (a) The obligation of the Contractor to pay the United States as provided in 24 this Settlement Contract is a general obligation of the Contractor notwithstanding the manner in
 - 23

which the obligation may be distributed among the Contractor's water users and notwithstanding
 the default of individual water users in their obligations to the Contractor.

3 (b) The payment of Charges becoming due hereunder is a condition precedent 4 to receiving benefits under this Settlement Contract. The United States shall not make water 5 available to the Contractor through Project facilities during any period in which the Contractor 6 may be in arrears in the advance payment of water Rates due the United States. The Contractor 7 shall not furnish water made available pursuant to this Settlement Contract for lands or parties 8 which are in arrears in the advance payment of water rates levied or established by the 9 Contractor.

(c) With respect to subdivision (b) of this Article, the Contractor shall have no
 obligation to require advance payment for water Rates which it levies.

CHARGES FOR DELINQUENT PAYMENTS

13 13. (a) The Contractor shall be subject to interest, administrative and penalty charges on delinquent installments or payments. When a payment is not received by the due 14 15 date, the Contractor shall pay an interest charge for each day the payment is delinquent beyond the due date. When a payment becomes 60 days delinquent, the Contractor shall pay an 16 17 administrative charge to cover additional costs of billing and processing the delinquent payment. 18 When a payment is delinquent 90 days or more, the Contractor shall pay an additional penalty charge of six percent per year for each day the payment is delinquent beyond the due date. 19 20 Further, the Contractor shall pay any fees incurred for debt collection services associated with a 21 delinquent payment.

(b) The interest charge rate shall be the greater of the rate prescribed quarterly in the Federal Register by the Department of the Treasury for application to overdue payments, or the interest rate of one-half of one percent per month prescribed by Section 6 of the Reclamation Project Act of 1939 (Public Law 76-260). The interest charge rate shall be determined as of the due date and remain fixed for the duration of the delinquent period.

(c) When a partial payment on a delinquent account is received, the amount
 received shall be applied, first to the penalty, second to the administrative charges, third to the
 accrued interest, and finally to the overdue payment.

9 10	16. During the performance of this Settlement Contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:

By executing this Settlement Contract, the Contractor agrees to immediately take any measures necessary to implement this obligation, including permitting officials of the United States to inspect premises, programs, and documents.

35 (c) The Contractor makes this agreement in consideration of and for the 36 purpose of obtaining any and all Federal grants, loans, contracts, property discounts, or other 37 Federal financial assistance extended after the date hereof to the Contractor by the Bureau of 38 Reclamation, including installment payments after such date on account of arrangements for 39 Federal financial assistance which were approved before such date. The Contractor recognizes 40 agrees that such Federal assistance will be extended in reliance on the representations and agreements made in this Article, and that the United States reserves the right to seek judicial

Subject to applicable Federal laws and regulations, each party to this Settlement Contract shall have the right during office hours to examine and make copies of each other's books and official records relating to matters covered by this Settlement Contract.

26 successors and assigns of the parties hereto, but no assignment or transfer of this Settlement
27 Contract or any right or interest therein shall be valid until approved in writing by the

1 (b) The assignment of any right or interest in this Settlement Contract by 2 either party shall not interfere with the rights or obligations of the other party to this Settlement 3 Contract absent the written concurrence of said other party.

4 (c) The Contracting Officer shall not unreasonably condition or withhold his 5 approval of any proposed assignment.

OFFICIALS NOT TO BENEFIT

7
8 24. (a) No Member of or Delegate to Congress, Resident Commissioner, or
9 official of the Contractor shall benefit from this Settlement Contract other than as a water user or
10 landowner in the same manner as other water users or landowners.

(b) No officer or member of the governing board of the Contractor shall receive any benefit that may arise by reason of this Settlement Contract other than as a landowner within the Contractor's service area and in the same manner as other landowners within the said service area.

15 CONTINGEN

CONTINGENT UPON APPROPRIATION OR ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS

16 25. The expenditure or advance of any money or the performance of any obligation of 17 the United States under this Settlement Contract shall be contingent upon appropriation or 18 allotment of funds. Absence of appropriation or allotment of funds shall not relieve the 19 Contractor from any obligations under this Settlement Contract. No liability shall accrue to the 20 United States in case funds are not appropriated or allotted.

CONFIRMATION OF SETTLEMENT CONTRACT

22 26. The Contractor, after the execution of this Settlement Contract, shall promptly 23 seek to secure a decree of a court of competent jurisdiction of the State of California, if 24 appropriate, confirming the execution of this Settlement Contract. The Contractor shall furnish 25 the United States a certified copy of the final decree, the validation proceedings, and all pertinent 26 supporting records of the court approving and confirming this Settlement Contract, and 27 decreeing and adjudging it to be lawful, valid, and binding on the Contractor. This Settlement 28 Contract shall not be binding on the United States until such final decree has been secured.

UNAVOIDABLE GROUNDWATER PERCOLATION

30 27. To the extent applicable, the Contractor shall not be deemed to have delivered

- 31 Project Water to Excess Lands or Ineligible Lands if such lands are irrigated with groundwater
- 32 that reaches the underground strata as an unavoidable result of the delivery of Project Water by

33 the Contractor to Eligible Lands.

PRIVACY ACT COMPLIANCE

2 28. (a) The Contractor shall comply with the Privacy Act of 1974 (5 U.S.C. 552a) 3 (the Act) and the Department of the Interior rules and regulations under the Act (43 CFR 2.45 et 4 seq.) in maintaining Landholder acreage certification and reporting records, required to be 5 submitted to the Contractor for compliance with Sections 206 and 228 of the Reclamation 6 Reform Act of 1982 (96 Stat. 1266), and pursuant to 43 CFR 426.18.

(b) With respect to the application and administration of the criminal penalty provisions of the Act (5 U.S.C. 552a(i)), the Contractor and the Contractor's employees responsible for maintaining the certification and reporting records referenced in (a) above are considered to be employees of the Department of the Interior. See 5 U.S.C. 552a(m).

7 (c) The Contracting Officer or a designated representative shall provide the
8 Contractor with current copies of the Interior Department Privacy Act regulations and the Bureau
9 of Reclamation Federal Register Privacy Act System of Records Notice (Acreage Limitation-10 Interior, Reclamation-31) which govern the maintenance, safeguarding, and disclosure of
11 information contained in the Landholder's certification and reporting records.

(d) The Contracting Officer shall designate a full-time employee of the
Bureau of Reclamation to be the System Manager who shall be responsible for making decisions
on denials pursuant to 43 CFR 2.61 and 2.64 amendment requests pursuant to 43 CFR 2.72. The
Contractor is authorized to grant requests by individuals for access to their own records.

16 (e) The Contractor shall forward promptly to the System Manager each 17 proposed denial of access under 43 CFR 2.64; and each request for amendment of records filed 18 under 43 CFR 2.71; notify the requester accordingly of such referral; and provide the System 19 Manager with information and records necessary to prepare an appropriate response to the 20 requester. These requirements do not apply to individuals seeking access to their own 21 certification and reporting forms filed with the Contractor pursuant to 43 CFR 426.18, unless the 22 requester elects to cite the Privacy Act as a basis for the request.

24 29. (a) Prior to the diversion of Project Water, the Contractor shall be

25 implementing an effective water conservation and efficiency program based on the Basin-Wide

26 Water Management Plan and/or Contractor's water conservation plan that has been determined

- 27 by the Contracting Officer to meet the conservation and efficiency criteria for evaluating water
- 28 conservation plans established under Federal law. The water conservation and efficiency
- 29 program shall contain definite water conservation objectives, appropriate economically feasible

The Contractor shall not divert Project 14 Water in excess of the quantities set forth in the Offer: Provided, however, if the Contractor's 15 diversions of Project Water exceed the quantities set forth in the Offer, the Contractor shall pay 16 to Reclamation the applicable Rates and Charges plus an amount equal to the applicable Rates and Charges, unadjusted for ability to pay, for each acre-foot of Project Water diverted in excess 17 18 of the quantities set forth in the Offer.

19 (3) If Reclamation decides not to accept the Offer, the Contractor's
20 payment obligation will remain as specified in Article 8(a)(1).

(4) The provisions of this Article 29(e) shall be in addition to and shall
not affect the provisions of Article 3(e) pertaining to the sale, transfer, exchange, or other
disposal of the Contract Total designated in Exhibit A.

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OPINIONS AND DETERMINATIONS

3 30. Where the terms of this Settlement Contract provide for actions to be (a) 4 based upon the opinion or determination of either party to this Settlement Contract, said terms 5 shall not be construed as permitting such action to be predicated upon arbitrary, capricious, or 6 unreasonable opinions or determinations. Both parties, notwithstanding any other provisions of 7 this Settlement Contract, expressly reserve the right to seek relief from and appropriate 8 adjustment for any such arbitrary, capricious, or unreasonable opinion or determination. Each 9 opinion or determination by either party shall be provided in a timely manner. Nothing in 10 subdivision (a) of Article 30 of this Settlement Contract is intended to or shall affect or alter the 11 standard of judicial review applicable under Federal law to any opinion or determination 12 implementing a specific provision of Federal law embodied in statute or regulation. 13 (b) The Contracting Officer shall have the right to make determinations 14 necessary to administer this Settlement Contract that are consistent with the provisions of this 15 Settlement Contract, the laws of the United States and of the State of California, and the rules 16 and regulations promulgated by the Secretary of the Interior. Such determinations shall be made 17 in consultation with the Contractor to the extent reasonably practicable. 18 CONTRACTOR TO PAY CERTAIN MISCELLANEOUS COSTS 19 31. In addition to all other payments to be made by the Contractor pursuant to (a) 20 this Settlement Contract, the Contractor shall pay to the United States, within 60 days after 21 receipt of a bill and detailed statement submitted by the Contracting Officer to the Contractor for 22 such specific items of direct cost incurred by the United States for work requested by the 23 Contractor associated with this Settlement Contract plus indirect costs in accordance with 24 applicable Bureau of Reclamation policies and procedures. All such amounts referred to in this

1 Article shall not exceed the amount agreed to in writing in advance by the Contractor. This 2 Article shall not apply to costs for routine contract administration. 3 (b) All advances for miscellaneous costs incurred for work requested by the 4 Contractor pursuant to Article 31 of this Settlement Contract shall be adjusted to reflect the 5 actual costs when the work has been completed. If the advances exceed the actual costs incurred, 6 the difference will be refunded to the Contractor. If the actual costs exceed the Contractor's 7 advances, the Contractor will be billed for the additional costs pursuant to Article 31 of this 8 Settlement Contract. 9 WAIVER OF DEFAULT 10 32. The waiver by either party to this Settlement Contract as to any default shall not 11 be construed as a waiver of any other default or as authority of the other party to continue such 12 default or to make, do, or perform, or not to make, do, or perform, as the case may be, any act or 13 thing which would constitute a default.
