Together, Reclamation and Service oversee all aspects of the Refuge Water Acquisition Program (RWAP). These agencies serve as primary contacts; represent the RWAP at various internal and external meetings; prepare and make presentations on the RWAP; and provide guidance and oversight to the technical support personnel on contracting, budget, and environmental issues. Reclamation and the Service have primary responsibility for RWAP's water acquisition strategy.

The California Department of Fish and Game (CDFG), as the State partner, oversees state wildlife areas, and provides guidance and technical assistance on costs share efforts as well as other RWAP efforts.

Program Goals and Objectives for FY 2012

To acquire 133,264 acre-feet (AF) of Incremental Level 4 Water (also called supplemental water) for critical wetland habitat supporting resident and migratory waterfowl, threatened and endangered species, and wetland dependent aquatic biota on the refuges. Status of the Program

Presently, Incremental Level 4 (Inc. L4) water consists of annual purchases from willing sellers such as the San Joaquin River Exchange Contractors Water Authority -- up to 49,583 AF of surface water; the East Side Canal & Irrigation Company -- up to 7,295 AF of surface water; as well as the Grassland Water District -- up to 10,000 AF of groundwater. In 1998 and 2005 the RWAP acquired 9,300 AF of permanent Inc. L4 surface water supplies.

The RWAP continues to use groundwater to lower costs and increase reliability of providing supplemental refuge water supplies with acquisitions from Grassland Water District (GWD) and by groundwater wells that are currently being constructed at the Volta Wildlife Area. The Volta wells will increase water supply reliability and help to diversify Level 2 Water. It is anticipated that these wells will produce up to 5,000 AF annually of which half will be Inc. L4 and half will be Diversified Level 2.

The RWAP has acquired an average of 58,829 AF of Inc. L4 Water annually since water year 1994 (excluding permanent water). Decisions about the use of Inc. L4 water are made in collaboration with the Interagency Refuge Water Management Team (IRWMT), which consists of representatives from Reclamation, the Service, CDFG, GWD, and the Central Valley Habitat Joint Venture.

The RWAP's FY 2012 staff labor costs, planned activities and associated budgets are highlighted in Table 1. Table 2 presents the RWAP's projected budgets for fiscal years 2013, 2014, and 2015.

Adaptive Management

Reclamation has worked with the Service, CDFG, and GWD in developing a Strategic Wetlands Best Management Plan (BMP) consistent with CALFED legislation (H.R. 2828), providing resources to support the development and implementation of a real-time monitoring network and other potential BMP analysis tools. The RWAP does not anticipate providing any 2012 funding for monitoring activities. However previous monitoring results have helped increase analysis and understanding of refuge in-bound and out-bound water quality, on-refuge water quality, and refuge water quality contributions to the lower San Joaquin River system. Changes in refuge water management and operations can be made, if feasible, to improve refuge water quality.
