Program Goals and Objectives for FY 2015:

Implement the San Joaquin River Restoration Program consistent with the Stipulation of Settlement (Settlement) for *NRDC*, et al., v. Rodgers, et al., and Section X of Public Law 111-11.

The San Joaquin River Restoration Program (Restoration Program) has two primary goals. The Restoration Goal is to restore and maintain fish populations in the main stem of the San Joaquin River below Friant Dam to the confluence of the Merced River, including naturally reproducing and self-sustaining populations of salmon and other fish. The Water Management Goal is to reduce or avoid adverse water supply impacts to all of the Friant Division long-term contractors that may result from implementation of the Settlement.

Pursuant to Section 10009(b)(2) of Public Law 111-11, the Restoration Program is authorized \$2,000,000 (October 2006 price levels) from the Central Valley Project Restoration Fund. The Restoration Program intends to use the authorized funds on environmental efforts and related actions associated for the construction of the Mendota Pool Bypass.
