CENTRAL VALLEY PROJECT IMPROVEMENT ACT ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT

SUMMARY

Subsection 3407(f) of the Central Valley Project Improvement Act (Public Law 102-575, Title XXXIV), provides for an annual financial report to the Senate Committee on Energy and Natural Resources and the Committee on Appropriations of the Senate, and the House Committee on Natural Resources, the House Committee on Merchant Marine and Fisheries, and the Committee on Appropriations of the House of Representatives. The annual report is to describe all Restoration Fund revenues and expenditures during the prior fiscal year and projected Restoration Fund revenues and expenditures during the next upcoming fiscal year.

This report is the second annual report prepared pursuant to Subsection 3407(f) of the Central Valley Project Improvement Act (CVPIA) and covers fiscal year 1994 actual revenues and expenditures and fiscal year 1996 projected revenues and expenditures. For purposes of this report revenues are actual collections processed, and expenditures are obligations incurred. Schedules 1 through 4 provide summary information on fiscal year 1994 Restoration Fund revenues and expenditures. Schedules 5 through 8 provide summary information on projected fiscal year 1996 Restoration Fund revenues and expenditures.

Fiscal Year 1994

Fiscal year 1994 Restoration Fund revenues totaled \$20,980,543. Fiscal year 1994 Restoration Fund expenditures were \$11,268,027. The fiscal year 1994 Restoration Fund balance, \$18,483,569 (fiscal year 1993 carryover \$8,771,053 + fiscal year 1994 revenues exceeding expenditures \$9,712,516) was carried over into the fiscal year 1995 program. Schedule 1 summarizes fiscal year 1994 Restoration Fund revenues and expenditures, including the carryover from 1993, and the Restoration Fund balance at September 30, 1994. Schedules 2 and 3 provide detail information on fiscal year 1994 revenues, including power payments, and water (irrigation, and municipal and industrial) payments by water service area. Schedule 4 lists the fish and wildlife restoration activities funded during fiscal year 1994 and the amounts attributable to each activity.

Fiscal Year 1996

For fiscal year 1996, Restoration Fund revenues are projected to be \$43,530,770 and CVPIA appropriations are \$43,579,000. This deficit of \$48,230 resulted from a change in the Consumer Price Index Units (CPIU) which lowered revenues by this amount. Schedule 5 shows the three projected revenue sources for fiscal year 1996 by authorizing subsection of the CVPIA.

The Restoration Fund revenues attributable to Project Water were projected by applying the applicable Restoration Fund rate to the projected paid fiscal year 1996 water deliveries. Annual Project Water delivery projections are updated annually under the Project's Irrigation and M&I water ratesetting policies, and these projections serve as the primary basis for projecting Restoration Fund water delivery revenues.

Transfer revenues were projected based on anticipated water transfers subject to the transfer provisions of the CVPIA. The Friant Division Surcharge rate for fiscal year 1996 is \$4 per acre-foot. This rate remains in effect through fiscal year 1997. The Restoration Payment rates for Project Water equate to a 1992 CPIU indexed rate of \$6 per acre-foot for irrigation water and \$12 per acre-foot for M&I water. These CPIU indexed rates are adjusted annually. No other Restoration Fund revenues were projected for fiscal year 1996, as provisions for such other charges are either not required or not anticipated to provide significant Restoration Funds in fiscal year 1996.

The fiscal year 1996 Restoration Fund appropriation of \$43,579,000 is shown in schedule 8. The schedule lists the fish and wildlife restoration activities projected to be funded during the fiscal year and the amounts attributable to each activity.

^{/1} Subsequent to the September 30, 1995 end date covered by this financial report, the President on November 13, 1995 signed into law the fiscal year 1996 Appropriations for Energy & Water Development (EWD). The conference report accompanying EWD included the following language regarding the CVPIA Restoration Fund:

The conference agreement includes \$12,281,000 for the Shasta Dam Temperature Control Device, \$1,000,000 above the budget request."

[&]quot; The conferees direct that the \$1,000,000 requested for the San Joaquin River Basin Resource Management Initiative, and any funds remaining from previous fiscal years, not be expended for that purpose. This action is consistent with action of the Congress during consideration of H.R. 1158. In the reports accompanying that bill, The Bureau of Reclamation was directed not to obligate any additional funds in fiscal year 1995 for the San Joaquin River Basin Resource Management Initiative.
