Purpose

Statement of Assignment

- 1) Reclamation and USFWS will conduct a "parallel process" to evaluate CVPIA program progress and completion:
 - 1) Develop a definition of complete at the programmatic level for CVPIA and for each individual program activity
 - 2) Develop objective criteria to assess the progress and effectiveness of individual programs
 - 3) Work closely with the stakeholders, interested parties, and the Restoration Roundtable to ensure that their information needs and concerns are recognized through this process
- 2) To the extent practicable, this "Parallel Process" will be coordinated with the Reclamation and USFWS PART* review of the CVPIA Program, in partnership with OMB.
 - Examine the purpose and performance of CVPIA Program at the highest level, focusing on 5 to 7 performance goals and measures --OMB Guidance
- 3) Campbell, Jeff, and Bernice will draft a purpose statement for the parallel process, including the desired outcomes by July 1.

PART Review

- Program Assessment and Rating Tool (PART)
 - Office of Management and Budget (OMB) review of federal programs
- A set of 25 common questions that evaluates program performance in four areas:
 - Program Purpose and Design (20%)
 - Strategic Planning (10%)
 - Program Management (20%)
 - Program Results (50%)
- Answers require clear explanations and rigorous supporting evidence
- Reassessments <u>can</u> occur each year & especially when significant program changes take place
- Information submitted to OMB for review & comment

Terminology & Definitions

Programs & Activities

- Preliminary Definitions:
 - Program
 - The overall effort to implement the provisions of CVPIA
 - Program Activities
 - The individual provisions of CVPIA (~38) that are being implemented by "Program Managers" at Reclamation and USFWS
 - Actions
 - Planning, implementation, and/or monitoring tasks that are deemed necessary to accomplish an established outcome.
 - » Typically, the program activity will define the outcome or guide the development of the outcome, and thus will require the development of supporting actions.
 - » However, some program activities may exclusively be an action or specific set of actions.

CVPIA Program Activity Review

- Review List of CVPIA Program Activities
 - All program activities eligible for funding from the Restoration Fund
- Assess the status of each program activity
- Confirm and refine program activity performance goals
- Clarify the agencies' interpretation and application of Section 3407 regarding program completion
- Establish ongoing program activity performance review procedures

- April 14: 1st official PART draft due to OMB
- February 2007: PART Review published with President's FY2008 budget

 July: Report on Results of CVPIA Program Activity Review

Outreach & Communication for Program Activity Review

Restoration Fund Roundtable

- Forum for the agencies to discuss the CVPIA Program and priorities with stakeholders and interested parties
- Agencies will report on progress approximately every other month

CVPIA Program Activity Review Working Group

- Detailed discussions of program assessment and performance measures for each program activity
- Meetings approximately weekly

Briefings and Public Outreach

Briefings and public outreach to provide progress reports and public review

Specific Program Activity Outreach

Use existing mechanisms to review specific program activities with interested parties

Participation & Responsibilities

- Working Group Meetings and Discussions for Program Activity Review are:
 - Open, public, and transparent
 - Inclusive, participatory, and representative of all interests
 - Agencies
 - Water and Power Contractors
 - Environmental Interests
 - Tribes
 - Other Interested Parties
 - Requires a commitment of time and energy to weekly meetings through July

Ground Rules

Participate Fully

- Ask for what you need from the meeting process and participants
- No cell phones, pagers, voicemail, etc.

Honor Time Constraints & Deadlines

- Use agendas to stay organized
- Keep comments and discussion concise
- Stay focused on the topic Use the parking lot for other issues

Respect Each Other

- Listen carefully to other team members
- Respond to ideas and issues, not individuals

Support Constructive Discussion

- Drop the history at the door
- Suggest improvements and solutions
- Build on others' ideas Use "and" instead of "but"

Support Responsible External Communication

- Inform and involve your managers in this process (and be cognizant of others' constraints)
- Be consistent (seek agreement on messages as a group)
- Represent the group positively (don't take storm clouds external)
- Bring issues and challenges to this group first

Draft Purpose Statement

- The purpose of the Central Valley Project Improvement Act
 (Act) Program Activity Review is to define completion criteria,
 clarify performance goals, and assess the status and
 progress of the Section 3406 and 3408 provisions of the Act.
 The Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) and Fish &
 Wildlife Service (Service) will conduct this Program Review
 with other federal and state agencies, stakeholders, and
 other interested parties.
- Reclamation and the Service will prepare a document summarizing the perspectives and conclusions of the Program Activity Review by July 1, 2006. The document will show the status and progress achieved in implementing the Act and recommendations for guiding future decisions in the development of program activities.

Terminology & Definitions

Definitions

- Performance Goal Sets a target level of performance over time expressed as a tangible, measurable objective, against which actual achievement can be measured
 - A performance goal includes:
 - Performance Measure (next slide)
 - Targets Quantifiable or measurable characteristic that tells how well a program must accomplish a performance measure
 - Timeframe The anticipated timeframe for achieving the performance measure (can be annual or long-term)
 - A performance goal should generally be related to program purposes and goals


Terminology & Definitions

Definitions

- Performance Measure Indicators, statistics, or metrics to gauge program performance
- There are two relevant types of *performance* measures:
 - Output Measures Internal activities of a program
 - Outcome Measures External events or conditions that result from the program for the beneficiaries or the public
