Background

In the early part of 1999, several landowners adjacent to Southern San Joaquin Municipal Utility District (SSJMUD) requested the annexation of their lands into SSJMUD boundaries, some of which required removal of lands from the Kern-Tulare Water District (KTWD)'s boundaries. On April 14, 1999, SSJMUD forwarded their request to the Kern County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo). The LAFCo approved the requests September 28, 1999. As a result of an oversight in 1999, the boundary changes to SSJMUD and KTWD were neither approved nor recognized by Reclamation. The inclusion of the lands into SSJMUD was reviewed by Reclamation in 2007, in Categorical Exclusion Checklist (CEC) 07-123; that document is incorporated by reference. For various reasons, no action was taken following the completion of CEC-07-123.

Purpose and Need for Action

SSJMUD and KTWD need Reclamation to change their district boundaries listed in Exhibit A of their existing repayment contracts, in order to recognize the LAFCo action. The annexations would provide SSJMUD the opportunity to further utilize their water supply, while assisting KTWD by reducing the demand on their distribution system.

Proposed Action




Figure 1 Map of Included and Excluded Parcels

Reclamation's action involves both the inclusion of lands into SSJMUD, and the exclusion of lands from KTWD. Reclamation would change the boundaries listed in Exhibit A of SSJMUD's repayment contract to include 16 parcels encompassing approximately 1.206.42 acres (Table 1, Figure 1). Reclamation would also change the boundaries listed in Exhibit A of KTWD's repayment contract to exclude 13 land parcels totaling approximately 925.73 acres (Table 2, Figure 1). No additional CVP water would be allocated due to this annexation.

Environmental Commitments

Reclamation, SSJMUD, KTWD and the landowners will implement the following environmental protection measures:

Resource	Protection Measure
Biological / Land	There will be no land use changes, construction, or property alterations related with this action.
Biological / Land	No conversion of pasture to other forms of agriculture (i.e. row crops or orchard) may occur unless Reclamation has been contacted and has confirmed that no federally protected species will be affected by the conversion.

Environmental consequences for resource areas assume the measures specified would be fully implemented.

I reviewed the proposed action as noted below:

In the early part of 1999, several landowners adjacent to Southern San Joaquin Municipal Utility District (SSJMUD) requested the annexation of their lands into SSJMUD boundaries, some of which required removal of lands from the Kern-Tulare Water District (KTWD)'s boundaries. On April 14, 1999, SSJMUD forwarded their request to the Kern County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) via Cornerstone Engineering. Inc. (Bakersfield, CA); the LAFCo approved the requests in Resolutions 99-14 and 99-16 dated September 28, 1999. As a result of an oversight in 1999, the boundary changes to SSJMUD and KTWD were neither approved nor recognized by Reclamation. The inclusion of the lands into SSJMUD was reviewed by Reclamation in 2007, in Categorical Exclusion Checklist (CEC) 07-12. For various reasons, no action was taken on CEC-07-123.

SSJMUD and KTWD need Reclamation to change the boundaries listed in Exhibit A of their existing repayment contracts, in order to recognize the LAFCo action. The annexations would provide SSJMUD the opportunity to further utilize their water supply, while assisting KTWD by reducing the demand on an over-tapped distribution system. Reclamation's action involves the inclusion of lands into SSJMUD, and the exclusion of lands from KTWD. Reclamation would change the boundaries listed in Exhibit A of SSJMUD's repayment contract to include 16 parcels encompassing approximately 1.206.42 acres. Reclamation would also change the boundaries listed in Exhibit A of KTWD's repayment contract to exclude 13 land parcels totaling approximately 925.73 acres. No additional CVP water would be allocated due to this annexation. The proposed action does not have a potential to affect Indian Trust Assets. Patricia

Re: 13-SCAO-045: Section 106 Review of Southern San Joaquin Municipal Utility District Reorganization #1

This proposed undertaking by Reclamation is to change the boundaries in exhibit A of the Southern San Joaquin Municipal Utility District (SSJMUD) repayment contract to include 16 parcels totaling 1,206.42 acres, and to change the boundaries in Exhibit A of the Kern-Tulare Water District (KTWD) repayment contract to exclude 13 parcels totaling 925.73 acres. These parcels were already receiving federal water through existing contracts and the water use and land use will not change due to this administrative modification. No additional Central Valley Project water would be allocated due to this action.

This is the type of undertaking that does not have the potential to cause effects to historic properties, should such properties be present, pursuant to the Section 106 regulations codified at 36 CFR Part 800.3(a)(1).
