#### **Proposed Action**

Vann Brothers is requesting permission to install, operate and maintain a temporary 10" irrigation pipe across the Tehama-Colusa Canal (Canal) right of way at Milepost 88.28 located in Section 9, Township 14 North, Range 3 West, Colusa County, CA. The pipeline would be laid atop the Canal and ground surface from source to irrigated field. The pipeline would also be hung by cables along the bridge. This proposed action would be permitted for a period as allowed by the Tehama Colusa Canal Authority or until environmental compliance review is completed for the permanent installation of 21" irrigation pipeline to serve the same irrigation area ((Draft CEC NCAO-CEC-13-15).


Explanation and/or remarks:

Installation of the 10" pipeline would be placed atop the land surface, roadway and attach to the bridge thereby not causing any disturbance to the ground, canal or bridge infrastructure etc. The pipeline would **not** require trenching on the existing gravel canal roadway or both sides of the canal so as to prevent disturbance to any Cultural Resources that may be present. However, aggregate base would be temporarily placed along the sides of the pipeline atop the TCCA access road to allow a smooth transition for vehicular travel along the roadway. Source water would be an existing permitted well located on private land across Reclamation's Canal and Cortina Vineyard Road bridge. The action area for this project is identified in Attachment 1. Details of the proposed action area are shown in Attachment 2. Photos of the action area are provided in Attachment 3.


The right-of-way to be utilized does not constitute typical habitat for any threatened or endangered species. The canal itself is concrete lined, and the TCCA regularly maintains the area and engages in a weed abatement program along both the right-of-way and in the canal. Therefore, no known threatened or endangered species, plants or animals will be affected by implementation of the proposed action.

The Tehama Colusa Canal Authority and Reclamation's engineer have reviewed this request and have no objections.



- Tehama-Colusa Canal (TCC), Milepost (MP) 88.28

The proposed undertaking to approve the temporary installation of an aboveground irrigation pipeline from an existing turnout on the TCC to an agricultural field on the opposite side of the TCC has no potential to cause effects to historic properties pursuant to 36 CFR §800.3(a)(1) of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (16 USC 470) Section 106 implementing regulations as amended.

The proposed action will involve the installation of an approximately 215-foot temporary 10-inch irrigation pipeline laid on the ground from an existing turnout on the north side of the TCC to an irrigated field on the south side of the TCC. The Vann Brothers have an urgent need to provide water to this parcel of their land. There is no change in land use or construction of any new facilities as a result of the proposed undertaking. A subsurface pipeline is proposed as a permanent fix for irrigation to this parcel and is currently undergoing Section 106 review as a separate undertaking.

After reviewing the proposed action in the Categorical Exclusion Checklist NCAO-CEC-13-18 titled *Vann Brothers Temporary Pipeline Crossing - Tehama-Colusa Canal, Milepost 88.28* dated April 23, 2013, I concur with line 8.
