Background

Donald Griffith (Applicant) owns a home adjacent and to the west of the Tracy Pumping Plant, a Federal facility managed by Reclamation (Exhibit A). The home was built about 25 years ago. Applicant has used a gravel road across Reclamation's right of way (Exhibit B) to access his home since it was built. Applicant states he had an agreement with Reclamation to use road but Reclamation has been unable to locate documentation of it. Applicant now desires to sell the home, but is unable to because there is no easement (legal authority) to travel upon or across Reclamation's land.

Purpose and Need for Action

The applicant needs the legal authority to cross Reclamation's property at Tracy Pumping Plant.

Proposed Action

Reclamation proposes to grant a non-exclusive easement allowing use of the existing gravel road adjacent to Tracy Pumping Plant (Exhibit B) to access the applicant's house. Reclamation would also issue a temporary license to allow the applicant to cross the property, while waiting for the easement to be recorded.

Exclusion Category


