### **Proposed Action**




Figure 4. Side view of project plumbing

Glide Water District (District) is requesting permission to modify an existing temporary turnout facility located on the Tehama Colusa Canal (Canal) at Milepost 49.26L (Figure 1). The modification includes replacing the existing screen with an 8-foot river screen with power drive and foot value at the turnout to automate removal of accumulations of algae that clog canal facilities serving the District. Presently the District must manually remove algae. A shallow well jet pump mounted on concrete blocks would be tied into the 8" PVC main and serve as the power source for water lines routed to the screen. The water lines (river screen cleaning wand, filter back flush return line, river screen basket drive) that would be served by the jet pump would also be made of PVC. These water lines would be routed through the bottom of an existing but presently abandoned 10" pipeline under the O&M canal road (see Figures 2, 3 and 4 for different perspectives). The use of this pipeline would constitute an extension of the existing right of way to the south by approximately 15 feet. The river screen would be anchored to one existing T bar post and one new T-Bar post along the canal embankment with steel cable. Minimal ground disturbance will be required.

The temporary turnout facility is located in Section 34, Township 20 North, Range 4 West, Mount Diable Base Meridian.

### **Exclusion Categories**

The Tehama Colusa Canal Authority and Reclamation's engineer have reviewed this request and have no objections.


The right-of-way to be utilized does not provide habitat for any threatened or endangered species. The canal itself is concrete lined, and the TCCA regularly maintains the area and engages in a weed abatement program along both the right-of-way and in the canal. Consequently there is no suitable substrate for burrows or vegetative cover, both of which are habitat requirements for burrowing owls and giant garter snakes, the listed species which could occur in the general vicinity. Therefore, no known threatened or endangered species, plants or animals are anticipated to be affected.

Algae that would be removed by the new system would be allowed to travel downstream as it did when manually removed. Therefore, no downstream effects are expected.

This proposed undertaking by Reclamation is to grant permission to the Glide Water District (GWD) to modify an existing temporary turnout facility located on the Tehama-Colusa Canal (TCC) at Milepost 49.26L. This is the type of undertaking that does not have the potential to cause effects to historic properties, should such historic properties be present, pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) Section 106 regulations codified at 36 CFR Part 800.3(a)(1).

The proposed action will include replacing the existing turnout screen with an 8-foot long river screen with power drive and foot valve at the turnout to automate removal of accumulations of algae that clog the GWD facilities. A shallow well jet pump mounted on concrete blocks will be tied into 8" PVC main and serve as a power source for water lines routed to the screen. The PVC water lines will be routed through an existing, but presently abandoned, 10-inch pipeline under the east bank TCC operation and maintenance road. The river screen will be anchored with steel cables to one existing T-bar post and one new T-bar post along the TCC embankment. These proposed actions are restricted to the TCC prism and levee, or areas already disturbed by the existing turnout facilities.

I concur with item 8 in NCAO-CEC-13-27 that this proposed action would not have significant impacts on properties listed, or eligible for listing, on the National Register of Historic Places as determined by Reclamation. With this determination, Reclamation has no further NHPA Section 106 obligations. This memorandum is intended to convey the completion of the NHPA Section 106 process for this undertaking. Please retain a copy in the administrative record for this action. Should changes be made to this action, additional NHPA Section 106 review, possibly including consultation with the State Historic Preservation Officer, may be necessary. Thank you for providing the opportunity to comment.
