Background

The Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) owns property near the town of Locke and Walnut Grove in southern Sacramento County, California, referred to as Delta Meadows (Figure 1). A section of this property was burned by a wildfire during the summer of 2013. The cause of the fire is unknown.

Purpose and Need for Action

Reclamation needs to make repairs and clean-up areas within Delta Meadows including those areas damaged by the fire.

Proposed Action

Reclamation proposes to conduct the following operation and maintenance activities within Delta Meadows:

- Remove metal debris and trash made visible by the recent onsite fire.
- Remove organic material and debris in and along approximately 2,000 feet of the onsite ditches. Material will be removed without disturbing the original contour of the ditches.
- Remove dead growth caused by the fire.
- Remove vegetation and/or limbs above Snodgrass Slough Road and inland.
- Conduct minor repairs to Snodgrass Slough Road such as filling ruts with gravel.

The activities will be done in the future on an as-needed basis.

Environmental Commitments

Reclamation and its subcontractor(s) shall coordinate with a SCCAO-biologist at least two weeks prior to any O&M activities proposed at Delta Meadows in order to determine the appropriate Conservation and Minimization Measures.

These may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Time restrictions for O&M activities to avoid disturbing special-status species.
- A qualified biologist who is familiar with area will survey along the project site area for special-status species prior to any debris or vegetation removal. Any potential habitat for special-status species will be flagged and identified as an Environmentally Sensitive Area. These areas will be avoided within the appropriate buffer area.
- A qualified biologist will monitor any O&M activities so that sensitive areas can be identified and avoided.

Environmental consequences for resource areas assume the measures specified will be fully implemented.

Exclusion Category

This proposed undertaking by Reclamation is to make repairs and conduct clean-up activities within Delta Meadows including areas damaged by a fire. This is the type of undertaking that does not have the potential to cause effects to historic properties, should such properties be present, pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) Section 106 regulations codified at 36 CFR Part 800.3(a)(1).

Reclamation proposes to conduct O&M activities within Delta Meadows including: remove metal debris and trash, remove organic debris and material along 2,000 feet of onsite ditches, remove dead vegetation caused by the fire, remove vegetation from the centerline of Snodgrass Slough Road, remove overhead limbs blocking Snodgrass Slough road, and conduct minor repairs to Snodgrass Slough Road such as filling ruts with gravel. There is no ground disturbance, construction of new facilities, alternation of existing facilities, or change in land use associated with this proposed action.

After reviewing the materials provided for the Section 106 determination of effect for this undertaking, I concur with item 8 in CEC-13-044, which states that this action would not have significant impacts on properties listed, or eligible for listing, on the National Register of Historic Places as determined by Reclamation. This memorandum is intended to convey the completion of the NHPA Section 106 process for this undertaking. Reclamation has no further obligations under NHPA Section 106, pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.3(a)(1). Please retain a copy in the administrative record for this action. Should changes be made to this project, additional NHPA Section 106 review, possibly including consultation with the State Historic Preservation Officer, may be necessary.
