#### **Proposed Action**




Figure 1. Proposed changes to the existing turnout.

Westside Water District (District) is requesting permission to modify an existing turnout (Lateral 10) that is used for the diversion of CVP water under Contract No. 14-06-200-8222-LTR1 from the Tehama-Colusa Canal (Canal) at Milepost 90.00L. This water would serve land owned by Peterson Ranch who is within the District boundary. Modifications would include adding a 16" steel pipe and flange to the 32" existing steel pipe with a new meter in an area that was previously disturbed when the turnout was constructed (Figure 1). The new connection will allow the lateral to operate near the maximum design flow of the venturi meter. Currently the flow is restricted to 8 cfs. The new pipe will be placed underground parallel to the existing pipe which its elevation is unknown at this time. All excavated material will be re-compacted to original condition.

Additionally, a portion of this facility was inadvertently built on Reclamation land (Attachment 1 &2). A new license agreement will be issued to the District for the portion of the facility which is encroached on Reclamation land and for the new 16" steel pipe and upgrades.

The facilities are located in Section 14, Township 15 North, Range 3 West, Mount Diable Base Meridian, Colusa County, CA.



Subject: 13-NCAO-268: Westside Water District (WWD) Upgrade to Existing Turnout Facilities – Tehama-Colusa Canal, Milepost 90.00L

This proposed undertaking by Reclamation is to grant permission to the WWD to modify an existing turnout facility located on the Tehama-Colusa Canal (TCC) at Milepost 90.00L. This is the type of undertaking that does not have the potential to cause effects to historic properties, should such historic properties be present, pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) Section 106 regulations codified at 36 CFR Part 800.3(a)(1).

WWD is requesting permission from Reclamation to modify an existing turnout (Lateral 10) that is used for the diversion of Central Valley Project (CVP) water, under Contract No. 12.06-200-8222-LTR1, from the Tehama-Colusa Canal at Milepost 90.00L. Modifications would include adding a 16" steel pipe and flange to the existing 32" steel pipe with a new meter in the area that was disturbed by the original turnout installation. The new pipe will be placed underground parallel and adjacent to the existing pipe with the excavated material replaced and recompacted. These proposed actions are restricted to areas already disturbed by the existing turnout facilities.

After reviewing the materials submitted for a Section 106 compliance assessment, I concur with item 8 in NCAO-CEC-13-28 that this proposed action would not have significant impacts on properties listed, or eligible for listing, on the National Register of Historic Places as determined by Reclamation. With this determination. Reclamation has no further NHPA Section 106 obligations. This memorandum is intended to convey the completion of the NHPA Section 106 process for this undertaking. Please retain a copy in the administrative record for this action. Should changes be made to this action, additional NHPA Section 106 review, possibly including consultation with the State Historic Preservation Officer, may be necessary. Thank you for providing the opportunity to comment.
