Nature of the Action




Figure 2. Project Location




Figure 3. Repeater Station Location

A land-use authorization would be granted to amend Central California Water Authority's (CCWA) existing permit to install, maintain, and operate a new, long-term radio repeater station (see Figure 1) at Bradbury Dam in Santa Barbara County, California (see Figure 2). CCWA's existing permit will expire in 2026. A 4' high by 2" diameter pole would be installed onto an existing permanent structure, which would be outfitted with radio and power equipment. The radio repeater station would be used to monitor water temperatures, and would be installed just south of the Bradbury Dam spillway along an access road (refer to Figure 3). Installation of the radio repeater station will not require any ground disturbance and would take one day to complete.

Environmental Commitments

Project-related vehicles shall remain on established roads.

Evaluation of Criteria for Categorical Exclusion

The proposed action involves the issuance of a land use authorization to Central California Water Authority to install, maintain, and operate a long-term radio repeater station at Bradbury Dam in Santa Barbara, California. A 4' high by 2" diameter pole outfitted with radio equipment used to monitor water temperatures would be installed onto an existing I-beam along an access road just south of the Bradbury Dam spillway. Installation will not require any ground disturbance.

This action is an undertaking as defined in Section 301(7) of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) (16 USC 470 *et seq.*). Upon review, Reclamation has determined that this undertaking involves the type of activity that does not have the potential to cause effects on historic properties listed or eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places. As such, Reclamation has no further obligations under Section 106 of the NHPA pursuant to 36 CFR 36 CFR § 800.3(a)(1).

This document communicates the completion of the NHPA Section 106 process and cultural resources review for this undertaking. Please retain a copy in the administrative record for this action. Should the proposed action change, additional NHPA Section 106 review, possibly including consultation with the State Historic Preservation Officer, may be necessary.
