Nature of Action: Removal of temporary structures and site clean-up on a 2.97 acre lot, located at the Fallon Field Office and Truckee-Carson Irrigation District (TCID) Headquarters.

Reclamation is proposing to remove:

- One modular building, 50' long x 28' wide (Figure 3, bldg. on right)
- One modular building, 57' long x 26' wide (Figure 3, bldg. on left)
- One carport shed, 24' long x 21' wide (Figure 6)
- Two mobile homes, 39' long x 10' wide (Figure 5)
- Two storage sheds (Figure 4)
- Concrete walkway located in front of modular building, 153' long x 4' wide x 3" deep
- One radio tower, 3 guy wires, and the 3' long x 3' wide x 18" deep concrete slab the tower sits on (Figure 3, center)

The modular buildings and mobile homes will be lifted using jacks, removed by trailer and rolled away. Buried gas lines, powerlines, waterlines, and one septic tank, will be abandoned in place. A second septic tank services the on-site warehouse and will be left in place.

The two storage sheds will be torn down using heavy equipment. The storage sheds do not have footers or a foundation so the removal of the sheds will not result in digging or extensive ground disturbance. The carport shed can be lifted up as is and removed from the site.

The radio tower and guy wires will be dismantled on site and the concrete pad it sits on will be removed and disposed of.

Asbestos and lead paint are not present in the structures. Mold is present in one of the modular buildings but has been inspected and it has been determined that it is not toxic black mold that requires hazmat team removal. The company contracted for the removal will be consulted on how to dispose.

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


Figure 1 - USGS Fallon Quad

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


Figure 3 - Two Modular Buildings and Radio Tower

Reclamation proposes to remove temporary field office structures, perform general site cleanup, and conduct minor earth moving activities on 2 acres of Reclamation land within the Truckee-Carson Irrigation District (TCID) Headquarters compound in Fallon, Nevada. This action constitutes an undertaking with the potential to cause effects to historic properties, requiring compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) as amended.

Reclamation completed a records search and field investigation. Just prior to fieldwork, Reclamation reviewed in-house documentation and past project data, conducted an online search of the Nevada Cultural Resources Inventory System (NVCRIS), and reviewed data available at the Nevada State Museum. A cultural resource pedestrian survey was completed by Mr. Scott Williams, Reclamation Archaeologist, on February 4, 2015. No historic properties were identified within the project APE through the records search or the pedestrian survey.

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.4(a)(4), Reclamation invited the Fallon Paiute-Shoshone Tribe to assist in the identification of properties in the project area which may be of religious and cultural significance to them. To date, no responses have been received. Reclamation will consider all tribal comments and contact your office as appropriate if any such properties are subsequently identified.

Reclamation consulted with the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) on a finding of no historic properties affected pursuant to 36 CFR §800.4(d)(1) in the attached letter dated March 17, 2015 (Certified receipt March 30, 2015) seeking concurrence with the finding that the undertaking results in no adverse effects to historic properties pursuant to [36 CFR §800.5(d)(1)]. The SHPO received the consultation package on March 30, 2015 and has yet to respond to Reclamations request for review and comment. Pursuant to the regulations at 36 CFR §800.5(c), a State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) has 30 days from receipt to review an agency finding. The regulations also state that "...the agency official shall then carry out the undertaking in accordance with paragraph (d)(1) of this section [§800.5(c)(1)]. Because the
