Exclusion Category: 516 DM 14.5 D.8 - Renewal of existing grazing, recreation management, or cabin site leases which do not increase the level of use or continue unsatisfactory environmental conditions.

Nature of Action: The proposed action is for the Bureau of Reclamation to issue permits to Shasta-Cascade Retriever Club and Sierra Nevada Retriever Club (Club) to use portions of land in and around Indian Lakes (Papoose Lake and Twin Lakes) to conduct club hunting dog retriever field trials and hunt tests. In the past, both Clubs have held this event at Harmon Reservoir since 1998 under a permit by Reclamation. This permit has been amended to include the Indian Lakes area. The Hunt Test and Field Trials would be held on two weekends per year from mid-April thru the end of May, with approximately 150 people attending each event.

Some participants will participate in dispersed camping along the shores of the reservoirs but primarily most will overnight in Fallon Nevada. The Clubs provide sani-huts and dumpsters at the event site and ensure all litter is removed in accordance with Federal, State and local laws and regulations. Both clubs plan to organize and participate in pre-event and post-event clean-up days. All portable toilets are required to be a minimum of 300 feet from all surface water sources. The Clubs are restricted to traveling on existing roads and previously disturbed areas. Participants are required to abide by outdoor fire restriction orders. Both Clubs have liability insurance for specials uses of Reclamation managed lands in the Newlands Project for these events.

No ground disturbing activities associated with digging or excavation will occur at the camp sites or in the areas where the field trials and hunt tests will occur. Vehicles will remain on established roads.

Timeline: This CEC will cover issuance of the annual permit thru December 31, 2019.

Location: The event is held at Indian Lakes in Churchill County on Reclamation withdrawn land. The legal description for the event is the area surrounding Indian Lakes in the E½ of Section 18, Township 20 North, Range 30 East, M.D.M. and N1/2 of Section 25, Township 20 North, Range 29 East, M.D.M. (Figure 1)




Figure 1 - Indian Lakes

Reclamation proposes issue permits to Shasta-Cascade Retriever Club and Sierra Nevada Retriever Club (Club) to use portions of land in and around Indian Lakes (Papoose Lake and Twin Lakes) to conduct club hunting dog retriever field trials and hunt tests. This is the type of undertaking that does not have the potential to cause effects to historic properties, should such properties be present, pursuant to the NHPA Section 106 regulations codified at 36 CFR § 800.3(a)(1). Reclamation has no further obligations under NHPA Section 106, pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.3(a)(1).

In the past, both Clubs have held this event at Harmon Reservoir since 1998 under a permit by Reclamation. This permit has been amended to include the Indian Lakes area. The Hunt Test and Field Trials would be held on two weekends per year from mid-April thru the end of May, with approximately 150 people attending each event. No ground disturbing activities associated with digging or excavation will occur at the camp sites or in the areas where the field trials and hunt tests will occur. Vehicles will remain on established roads.

Reclamation proposes to permit the event through the issuance of a Land Use Authorization. After reviewing documentation provided within CEC-15-08, Reclamation has concluded this action would not have significant impacts on properties listed, or eligible for listing, on the National Register of Historic Places. This document serves as notification that Section 106 compliance has been completed for this undertaking. Please note that if project activities subsequently change, additional NHPA Section 106 review, including further consultation with the SHPO, may be required.

This document is intended to convey the completion of the NHPA Section 106 process for this undertaking. Please retain a copy in the administrative record for this action. 


Figure 1 - Indian Lakes
