Background




Figure 1 Proposed Action Area

The Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) received a request for approval of a title change to an established federal contract. On May 6, 2013, Virginia L. Lempesis, Trustee of the Virginia L. Lempesis Separate Property Trust (Seller) executed a "Purchase and Sale Agreement and Escrow Instructions" with Kenneth J. Carvalho and Karen E. Carvalho (Buyer) for real property located in Fresno County. The real property consists of 240 acres, which include, without limitation, all improvements owned by Seller and includes all of the Seller's interest in and to the federal Contract between the United States and Viriginia L. Lempesis, Trustee of the Viriginia L. Lempesis Separate Property Trust providing for the Adjustment and Settlement of Certain Claimed Water Rights Contract No. 11-WC-20-0026 (Contract). The contract is for the settlement and adjustment of certain claimed water rights to the San Joaquin River under the 1939 Purchase Contract, downstream of the Friant Dam along the Fresno Slough. The United States is willing to deliver to the contractor and the contractor is willing to accept up to 600 acre feet per year of Central Valley Project water from the Mendota Pool for the irrigation of approximately 215 acres located within the area shown in Exhibit "A" of the Contract (see Figure 1).

Nature of the Action

Reclamation proposes to approve a title change to Contract No. 11-WC-20-0026 from Virginia L. Lempesis as Trustee of the Virginia L. Lempesis Separate Property Trust Providing for the Adjustment and Settlement of Certain Claimed Water Rights, to Kenneth J. Carvalho and Karen E. Carvalho, Husband and Wife as reflected in change of ownership of real property in Fresno County California. The Proposed Action area is shown on Figure 1.

Exclusion Category

Reclamation proposes to change Contract No. 11-WC-20-0026 from Virginia L. Lempesis to Kenneth J. Carvalho and Karen E. Carvalho to reflect change in ownership of approximately 240 acres in Fresno County California. Authorization of the proposed action constitutes an undertaking as defined in Section 301(7) of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) (16 USC 470 *et seq.*).
