Proposed Action

The Tehama County Public Works Department (County) has requested permission to perform investigative sampling of spoils from the construction of the Tehama Colusa Canal (TCC) placed on the Bureau of Reclamation's (Reclamation) land at TCC milepost 8.20. The site is a TCC right-of-way (ROW) along the south bank of Elder Creek, approximately one-half mile west of San Benito Avenue in Gerber, CA. The current Proposed Action is limited to the collection of approximately 20 representative samples of the spoils along the length of the ROW using hand tools.

The purpose of the sampling and associated geotechnical analyses is to determine if the physical properties of the material support its appropriateness for use in the repair of an adjacent levee embankment that has suffered severe erosion. If the material is determined suitable for use in construction, approximately 5,000 cubic yards of spoil (if available at the site based on a future survey) would be excavated from the ROW and placed along the embankment as a second action.

The Tehama-Colusa Canal Authority (TCCA) and Reclamation's Engineer have reviewed the Proposed Action. It has been determined the proposed sampling activities will not interfere with the operation and maintenance of the TCC. This action will begin in September 2015 so that subsequent levee repairs, if approved, could be completed prior to the 2015 winter season in preparation for predicted heavy rains which could further compromise the levee.

The ROW to be used for this action has been previously disturbed and does not provide habitat for any species Federally-listed as Threatened or Endangered. The canal itself is concrete lined. The TCCA regularly maintains the area and engages in a weed abatement program along both the ROW and in the canal.




Figure 1. Location of the proposed sampling area.



The Tehama County Public Works Department (County) is requesting permission to perform investigative sampling for the possible excavation of spoils from the construction of the Tehama Colusa Canal (TCC) placed on the Bureau of Reclamation's (Reclamation) land in the TCC right-of-way (ROW) at Elder Creek, approximately one-half mile west of San Benito Avenue in Gerber, CA. Sampling will be conducted with hand tools within the spoil pile and will not enter native soils.

If found suitable for use in placement activities, approximately 5,000 cubic yards of spoils will be excavated and used to repair a stretch of levee embankment approximately 415 feet long along the south bank of Elder Creek at TCC milepost 8.20. Additional cultural resources compliance will be required should the TCC spoils materials be used for levee repairs.

Reclamation has determined that the proposed action to collect soil samples has no potential to cause effects on historic properties pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.3(a)(1). As such, Reclamation has no further obligations under 54 U.S.C. § 306108, commonly known as Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act. This document communicates the completion of the NHPA Section 106 review process for this undertaking and concurrence with Item 8 of the CEC that there will be no significant impacts on historic properties. If changes to the proposed action are made, additional review under Section 106, including consultation with the State Historic Preservation Officer, may be required. Please retain a copy of this document with the administrative record for this action.
