## **Proposed Action**

On October 23, 2015, by Grant Deed recorded in the Official Records of the County of Colusa, California as Document No. 2015-0003526, Green Valley Corporation and Joseph L. Wucher and Jenny B. Wucher voluntarily conveyed all interest of the land within the Contractor's Service Area delineated in Exhibit B of Sacramento River Settlement Contract No. 14-06-200-5211A-R-1 to Swenson Farms, LLC.

At the request of the new property owners, Reclamation will assign the interests in Sacramento River Settlement Contract No. 14-06-200-5211A-R-1 from Green Valley Corporation to Swenson Farms, LLC to correspond with the change in property ownership. Reclamation's authority for the action is granted by Article 33 of the Settlement Contract.

The property is located in a portions of Township 17N, Range 2W, Sections 1, 2, & 3 (Attachment 1), Colusa County, CA. The latitude/longitude is approximately 122°2'49.89"W, 39°21'33.58"N. The property is in agricultural production and will remain so for the foreseeable future.




I have determined that there is no likelihood that this project will adversely impact Indian Trust Assets.

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Reclamation proposes to assign the interests in Sacramento River Settlement Contract No. 14-06-200-5211A-R-1 from Green Valley Corporation and Joseph L. Wucher and Jenny B. Wucher to Swenson Farms, LLC to correspond with a change in property ownership by Grant Deed recorded in the Official Records of the County of Colusa, California on October 23, 2015 as Document Nos. 2015-0003526. Reclamation's authority for the action is granted by Article 33 of the Settlement Contract.

Reclamation has determined the proposed action constitutes a Federal undertaking that does not have the potential to cause effects on historic properties, should such properties be present, pursuant to the National Historic Preservation Act Section 106 regulations codified at 36 CFR § 800.3(a)(1). As such, Reclamation has no further obligations under Section 106 of the NHPA.
