Nature of the Action

The Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) proposes to approve the request from Westlands Water District (Westlands) to deliver up to 10,000 acre-feet (AF) of its Central Valley Project (CVP) water supply at an alternate point of delivery. The alternate point of delivery will be Contra Costa Water District's (CCWD) Old River Intake (ORI) and/or Middle River Intake (MRI), north of Jones Pumping Plant. The 10,000 AF is limited to the CVP water supply made available in the 2017 Contract Year pursuant to Contract #14-06-200-495A-IR5 (Contract). Article 3(c)(1) of the Contract allows for changes in points of delivery in or north of the Delta in conjunction with Article 5(a). All Project Water delivered to Westlands under the terms of the Contract at the ORI and/or the MRI will be conveyed to Los Vaqueros Reservoir for storage. At this time there is no plan to remove Westlands CVP water from storage. Additional review and approval from Reclamation will be required prior to release of Westlands CVP water supply from storage in Los Vaqueros Reservoir.

Environmental Commitments

The Proposed Action shall be conducted in compliance with the requirements of all existing biological opinions governing the operation of the intakes in the delta and diversions to Los Vaqueros Reservoir.

Reclamation proposed to approve the request from Westlands Water District (Westlands) to deliver up to 10,000 acre-feet (AF) of its Project Water at an alternate point of delivery. This is the type of undertaking that does not have the potential to cause effects to historic properties, should such properties be present, pursuant to the NHPA Section 106 regulations codified at 36 CFR § 800.3(a)(1). Reclamation has no further obligations under NHPA Section 106, pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.3(a)(1).

Westlands would deliver up to 10,000 acre-feet (AF) of its Project Water at an alternate point of delivery. The alternate point of delivery will be Contra Costa Water District's (CCWD) Old River Intake (ORI) and/or Middle River Intake (MRI), north of Jones Pumping Plant. The 10,000 AF is limited to the supply made available in the 2017 Contract Year under Contract #14-06-200-495A-IR5 (Contract). Article 3(c)(1) of the Contract allows for changes in points of delivery in or north of the Delta. All Project Water delivered to Westlands under the terms of the Contract at the ORI and/or the MRI will be conveyed to Los Vaqueros Reservoir for storage. The water will be pumped from the Delta into Los Vaqueros through existing facilities. No ground disturbance or modification of facilities will be needed to move this water into storage.

This document is intended to convey the completion of the NHPA Section 106 process for this undertaking. Please retain a copy in the administrative record for this action. Should changes be made to this project, additional NHPA Section 106 review, possibly including consultation with the State Historic Preservation Officer, may be necessary.
