Proposed Action

On September 4, 2009 Reclamation entered into a Voluntary Full Contract Assignment of Sacramento River Settlement Contract No. 14-06-200-889A-R-1 with Sioux Creek Property, LLC. On May 22, 2017 the owners of the land within the Contractor's Service Area, as delineated in Exhibit B of the contract (Figure 2), informed Reclamation that they have transferred ownership of the land into another family entity.

By Grant Deed recorded in the Official Records of Sutter County, California as Document No. 2017-0003663, all interest of the land within the Contractor's Service Area delineated in Exhibit B of Sacramento River Settlement Contract No. 14-06-200-889A-R-1 was conveyed to Knights Landing Properties, LLC.

At the request of the property owners, Reclamation will assign the interest in Sacramento River Settlement Contract No. 14-06-200-889A-R-1 from Sioux Creek Property, LLC to Knights Landing Properties, LLC, to correspond with the change in property ownership. Reclamation's authority for the action is granted by Article 33 of the Settlement Contract.

The property is located in portions of Township 12N, Range 2E, Sections 26 & 27, Sutter County, CA (Figure 2). The Sutter County Tax Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) is 29-190-012-000 (Figure 3). The latitude/longitude is approximately 38°51'29.492"N, -121°43'29.036"W. The property is in agricultural production and will remain so for the foreseeable future.


I have examined the referenced proposal and have determined that the property is at least 21.5 miles from the closest Indian Trust Asset.

Reclamation proposes to assign the interest in Sacramento River Settlement Contract No. 14-06-200-889A-R-1 from Sioux Creek Property, LLC to Knights Landing Properties, LLC, to correspond with the change in property ownership, at the request of the new owners. On September 4, 2009 Reclamation entered into a Voluntary Full Contract Assignment of Sacramento River Settlement Contract No. 14-06-200-889A-R-1 with Sioux Creek Property, LLC. On May 22, 2017 the owners of the land within the Contractor's Service Area informed Reclamation that they have transferred ownership of the land into another family entity. The proposed action does not involve a change in land use or construction.

Reclamation determined that the proposed action is the type of undertaking that does not have the potential to cause effects on historic properties, should such properties be present, pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.3(a)(1). As such, Reclamation has no further obligations under 54 U.S.C. § 306108, commonly known as Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA).
