Proposed Action

In response to a request from the Water Master, Stony Creek and Tributaries, Reclamation will correct Contract Number 2-07-20-W0261-LTR1 (Contract), Stony Creek Water District (District), Central Valley Project, California.

Changes will include corrections to Exhibit C Base Supply to properly list the water rights established by the Angle Decree and reduce the Project Water quantity and increase the Base Supply volume, and corrections in the text in Articles 3(a)(1) and 3(a)(2) to reflect the correction to Exhibit C.


ITA Designee concurred with Item 11 (email attached).

By letter dated December 4, 2007, Mr. George Wilson, Water Master, Stony Creek and Tributaries, brought to Reclamation's attention that the Base Supply quantity in Article 3(a)(1) and Exhibit C of the Contract did not properly reflect the water rights established by the Angle Decree. Mr. Wilson provided corrected Exhibit C indicating the necessary changes. The corrected volumes have been confirmed accurate by the current Water Master, Mr. George Pendell.

As a result of the correction, the Base Supply volume will increase from 425 acre-feet (af) to 475 af and the Project Water volume will decrease from 2,920 af to 2,870 af. The Contract Total will remain unchanged at 3,345 af.

Both the District and the Water Master have requested the corrections. Since the water rights of Stony Creek have been adjudicated in Federal Court, it is incumbent upon Reclamation to correct the errors on Exhibit C and in Articles 3(a)(1) and 3(a)(2) of Contract No. 2-07-20-W0261-LTR1.

The action is administrative in nature; No construction, ground disturbance or change in land use will result from the action.

In response to a request from the Water Master, Stony Creek and Tributaries, Reclamation will correct Contract Number 2-07-20-W0261-LTR1 (Contract), Stony Creek Water District (District), Central Valley Project, California. This is the type of undertaking that does not have the potential to cause effects to historic properties, should such properties be present, pursuant to the NHPA Section 106 regulations codified at 36 CFR § 800.3(a)(1). Reclamation has no further obligations under NHPA Section 106, pursuant to 36 CFR § 800.3(a)(1).

As a result of the correction, the Base Supply volume will increase from 425 acre-feet (af) to 475 af and the Project Water volume will decrease from 2,920 af to 2,870 af. The Contract Total will remain unchanged at 3,345 af. Both the District and the Water Master have requested the corrections. Since the water rights of Stony Creek have been adjudicated in Federal Court, it is incumbent upon Reclamation to correct the errors on Exhibit C and in Articles 3(a)(1) and 3(a)(2) of Contract No. 2-07-20-W0261-LTR1. No construction, ground disturbance or change in land use will result from the action.

This document is intended to convey the completion of the NHPA Section 106 process for this undertaking. I concur with Item #8 of CCAO-NM-CEC-1710 that there will be no significant impacts from this action on properties listed, or eligible for listing, on the National Register of Historic Places as determined by Reclamation (LND 02-01) (43 CFR 46.215 (g). Please retain a copy in the administrative record for this action. Should changes be made to this project, additional NHPA Section 106 review, possibly including consultation with the State Historic Preservation Officer, may be necessary.
