Background

The Friant-Kern Canal is a part of the Bureau of Reclamation's Central Valley Project, and provides water to the eastern portion of the San Joaquin Valley. ACMPC California 5, LLC, has submitted a land use application requesting authorization to operate and maintain an existing 18-inch steel water pipeline that runs under the Friant-Kern Canal, at approximately milepost 69.22, for the continued conveyance of irrigation water from an existing well to an existing pump station.

Nature of the Action

Reclamation would issue a land use authorization for the continued operation and maintenance of an existing pipeline. The proposed action is strictly administrative, no ground disturbance or modification of the facility would occur.

Exclusion Category
