CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION CHECKLIST Millerton Lake State Recreation Area South Finegold Non-motorized Boat Access Ramp




Figure 1. Proposed Action Location

<u>Background</u>: Millerton Lake State Recreation Area (MLSRA) is located near Friant, California, 20 miles northeast of Fresno (Figure 1). The California Department of Parks and Recreation (CDPR) operate the MLSRA under an operating agreement with the Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation). South Finegold is a day use area within the MLSRA consisting of picnic tables, barbecues, restrooms, and a small parking lot (Figure 2). Non-motorized boaters often use this area but are required to hike down to the water through a steep area since there isn't a boat launch at this site. California Department of Boating and Waterways has proposed installing a non-motorized boat ramp to provide better access at this site for non-motorized boaters (Figure 3).

<u>Purpose and Need for Action</u>: The purpose of the Proposed Action is to provide an easier path for launching non-motorized boats from the existing parking area. The Proposed Action is needed in order to provide safer access for non-motorized boaters.

Proposed Action: CDPR proposes, on behalf of Reclamation, to have the California Department of Boating and Waterways install a non-motorized boat ramp within the South Finegold day use area with associated upgrades (see attached preliminary designs). The Proposed Action is located within the northeast quarter of Section 26, Township 10 South, Range 21 East, MDB&M (see Figure 1). Upgrades would consist of:

- Installation of a 20-feet wide by 200-feet long non-motorized concrete boat ramp with boarding float
- Installation of a concrete walk with hand rails from the loading zone to the boat ramp
- Installation of approximately 130 linear feet rip rap for shoreline stabilization
- Repaying and delineation of American with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant parking stalls in the existing parking area
- Relocation of some ADA signage
- Demolition and replacement of some curbs and walkways near the loading zone
- Installation of new concrete wheel stops
- Installation of new concrete truncated domes for accessibility
- Trimming of two oak trees

CDPR is in the process of preparing an environmental document as required by the California Environmental Quality Act and will be applying for the necessary 404 and 401 permits. Copies of all permits would be provided to Reclamation. The Proposed Action would not begin unless all applicable permit/certification are obtained and would require that the Project Proponent adheres to the terms and conditions of said permit/certification.

Construction equipment would include: a bulldozer, dump truck, concrete truck, and backhoe. Construction would begin in early September 2011 and is expected to last approximately 90 days. Staging would occur within the existing parking area.

Exclusion Category: 516 DM 14.5C (3). Minor construction activities associated with authorized projects which correct unsatisfactory environmental conditions or which merely augment or supplement, or are enclosed within existing facilities.





